Boxer Dave Sands Killed In Accident

(By Harold Tilley) NEWCASTLE, Australia, Aug. 11—(Reuters)—Dave Sands, 26-year-old British Empire middleweight boxing champion, died in hospital today from head and internal injuries received in a highway accident.

His brother Alfie—also a well-known Australian boxer—and his infant daughter, Lillian, were slightly injured. So were four other family friends travelling in the truck.
