

# New Allowance For Sea Duty Becomes Effective For Navy

OTTAWA (CP)—A new \$15 monthly sea duty allowance takes effect today for all officers and men aboard navy ships.

An estimated 10,000 persons will be covered by the allowance which replaces the foreign service allowance which was paid on a sliding scale.

The biggest benefit of the new system is for enlisted men. Under the foreign service allowance, leading seamen and lower ranks received \$9 a month, while chief petty officers were eligible for \$16.50 and lieutenants \$18.

While the standard \$15 rate means a reduction for higher ranks, a navy spokesman said this would be more than made up in the vast majority of cases by wider application of the new allowance.

The foreign service allowance was paid only when navy personnel on a ship were outside Canadian waters for a continuous period of 30 days or more. The new allowance will apply as long as a man is posted to a ship, whether it is at sea or tied up in a Canadian or foreign port.

**SYSTEM OUTMODED**

"The old system wasn't doing the job it was intended to do," the spokesman added.

"Quite often a ship would be away for only three or four weeks, and the men would lose the allowance if they returned to a Canadian port inside the 90-day limit."

"Now they get it as long as they are aboard the ship."

The wider application is borne out by the navy's estimate that the allowance will cost \$1,500,000 a year. The foreign service allowance cost about \$227,000.

The navy said the allowance approved Thursday by the government was to make up for living conditions aboard

ships, "which, although improving steadily, suffer by comparison to those ashore, and frequent extended separation of married personnel from wives and families."

A typical leading seaman—married and receiving trades pay—now gets \$381 a month, including subsistence allowance. A chief petty officer with top rate trades pay gets \$577 while a lieutenant with about two years at that rank gets \$618.

## Tobacco Co. Signs New Wage Pact

MONTREAL (CP)—Imperial Tobacco Co. and the Tobacco Workers Union (CIC) have signed a new agreement giving workers a general wage increase of 20 cents an hour spread over three years.

A joint statement by the company and union here said the agreement covers 3,500 employees in seven plants. The workers involved are employed at Imperial plants in Montreal, Granby, Que., Joliette, Que., and Guelph, Ont., and General Cigar Co. of Montreal, B. Houde and Groulx Inc., Quebec City, and Tacket Tobacco Ltd., Hamilton, Ont.

The agreement includes establishment of a joint committee to study means of minimizing effects of automation on employees and a reduction in working hours with the same take-home pay.

The wage increase allows for 11 cents the first year, and nine

cents in each of the second and third years.

The average hourly wage rate in Imperial plants now is \$2.71 an hour for men and \$2.40 for women. The agreement also allows wage parity for employees at B. Houde and Groulx in Quebec City.

## Scotland Yard May Be On Trail Of Vast Wealth

LONDON (Reuters)—Scotland Yard said it has obtained information that may solve the 80-year-old mystery of the 'hiding place' of a multi-million-dollar hoard of jewelry, gold and paintings that belonged to Benito Mussolini.

The information has been sent to the Rome police.

Scotland Yard said it had been told the treasure was buried at a farm a few miles from the late Italian dictator's birthplace, Varano d'Costa, a hamlet on the northern Adriatic.

The treasure has been sought ever since the end of the Second World War.

## Testimony By Witnesses Is Said Modified

TORONTO (CP)—Two teen-aged witnesses for the crown at a United Church minister's trial in Chatham, Ont., last year on charges of contributing to juvenile delinquency, have changed their stories, Attorney-General Arthur Wishart said Tuesday.

"I wouldn't say they've retracted what they said at the trial, but they've modified it," Mr. Wishart said.

Rev. Russell Horburgh, who later resigned from the ministry, was sentenced to one year on a conviction of five of eight charges.

Several members of a church youth group testified at the trial they had sexual intercourse in Park Street church with Mr. Horburgh's knowledge and encouragement.

Mr. Horburgh, appealing the conviction, is free on \$2,500 bail.

Victim of the falsecard was John Rau (South), well known New York expert. Rau ducked the spade lead, losing to the king, and was forced to play the queen and ace together on the space return.
