

PEI Amateur And Moncton Pro Pace First 18 Holes

A former Island amateur champion and a veteran professional grabbed the lead in the NB-PEI Amateur and Open Golf Tournament as the first 18 holes of the 72-hole tournament were completed at the Belvedere course yesterday evening.

Derwyn Heustis, a Summerside golfer playing out of the Charlottetown Club and professional Alan Ogilvie of Moncton scored par 72s to go one up on defending champion Cecil Dowling of Charlottetown who finished with a 73 in the morning.

Heustis went out in 35 and earned his 72 with a 37 on the incoming nine. Ogilvie carded a 36 on the first nine and came home with the same score. Dowling was 35 on the way out and 38 - one over par - coming in.

Locked up in a 2-way tie for fourth spot are Bathurst pro Pete Kelly and Charlottetown amateur Don MacDonald with 74s. The duo had identical scores of 37-37.

Ralph Harley of Moncton, Pete Campbell of St. Croix and Dick Bagnall of Fredericton were in sixth spot with scores of 75. Campbell's score gave the veteran golfer the lead in the senior competition. 2 strokes up of F. Mavor of Edmundston.

Ben Gray Jr. of Edmundston shot a hot 78 for a 5-stroke lead in the play for the junior title. Gray had scores of 41 and 37. John Estabrooks of Westfield was second with 45-38 for 83. D. Irving of Fredericton held down third spot with an 84.

ADVERSE WEATHER
The first 18 holes were played under rather adverse conditions with leaden skies and intermittent drizzle which turned into a downpour late in the afternoon preventing birds to crack the 72-par score. If the golf was not spectacular it was steady and the NB-P.E.I. Association President, John Wostenholme, reported a record number of scores under 80 for a 72-hole course.

This morning play will begin in second 18 holes with the professionals once again leading the way with 16-time at 7:30.

Island golfers were bidding strongly for spots on the Willingdon Cup Team holding down 5 of the first 8 spots in the amateur divisions. Sandviching R.H. Hurley, G.J. Campbell, and R.H. Bagnall tied for third place with their 75s. are Derwyn Heustis in the lead, Don MacDonald in second and Merlin MacKenzie, Art MacKenzie and J. Beaton, all of Charlottetown with scores of 76, in sixth place.

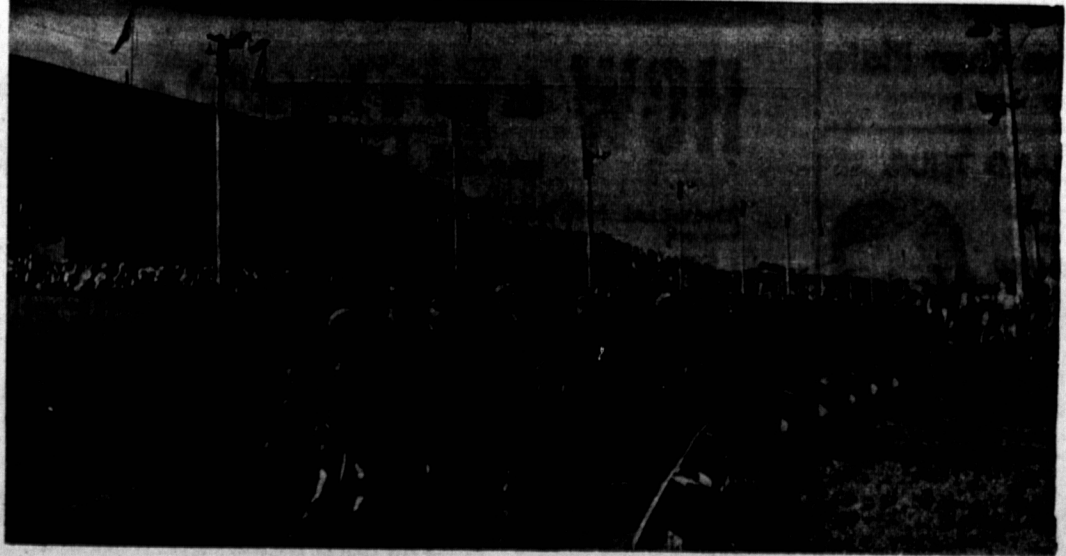

CHICAGO, N.Y. (AP)—Chicago White Sox bombed Bob Miller, an 18-year-old bonus pitcher, for eight runs in a big third inning Monday and coasted to a 13-4 romp over St. Louis Cardinals in the annual Hall of Fame trophy game before 8,500 fans at Doubleday Field.

Twelve White Sox went to bat in the big inning for four singles, two doubles, and a two-run homer by Jim Rivera. The young high school grad also walked two batters.

Chicago added another pair in the fifth off Miller and three more in the eighth on Walt Dropp's three-run homer off Wilmer (Vinegar Bend) Mizell.

Mystified by the fine southpaw pitching of 17-year-old Jim Derrington, the Cardinals finally broke into the scoring column with two in the seventh. St. Louis picked up another pair in the ninth off Bill Fischer who worked the last two innings.

With the Cardinals in the midst of the National League pennant race, manager Freddie Hutchinson let his bonus pitcher stay in HRs: Chi-Rivera, Dropp.
