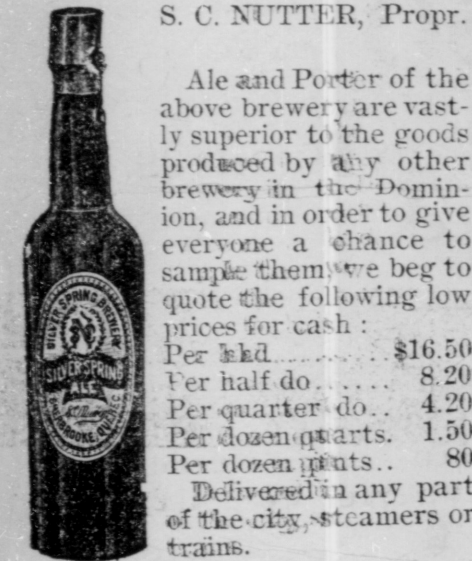

A GOLD THRUST.

The most gigantic trust the world has known is in process of formation in London. It is a gold trust which plans to control the entire output of gold and put even nations at its mercy. Everything is being kept secret, and all the principals deny it, but all indications point to its existence.

Alfred Beit is the richest individual in London. He has one ambition—to be the richest man in the world. Beit is little known in the social world, though he has one of the finest houses in Park Lane. He is a German by birth, and of Jewish blood, 47 years old, a bachelor, a small, nervous man, with a blonde mustache, which he is always nervously pulling.

He is the leading spirit in the firm of Werner, Beit & Company, who control the majority of the South Africa gold mines. Clever as Barnato, without any of that plunger's follies, he builds on actual properties, not on paper or holdings on paper. Beit and his allies to day show a market value of \$975,000,000, and Beit wants to make himself a billionaire. He hopes to do it through the gold trust, and plans to be the real Napoleon of finance. He has no fads or hobbies or reckless extravagance for social ambitions; dresses extremely modest, has a beautiful palace, with only himself in it; is not miserly, spends indifferently what would be an enormous fortune for an ordinary man, but is a mere bagatelle to him.

WANTS POWER, NOT MONEY.

He is beyond the point of making money to spend or for lavish display, and seeks only the power which money can give. Beit is quoted as saying: "I make no boast about being the Napoleon of finance until I really am, and can make good the title."

For eight months the gold trust scheme has been in slow process of formation. Africa produces a majority of the world's supply of gold, and Beit controls a majority of the African output. Therefore he has an excellent foundation to build upon. He found his first allies in what is known as the "Barney Barnato crowd," headed by Wolf Joel.

The next largest African mine owner is J. B. Robinson. He is said to have been induced to enter the project. Another factor to be considered was Rhodes. He controls the diamonds. Beit's arrangement is for Rhodes to let the gold crowd go ahead as they please and not touch the diamonds, while they give him every assistance in carrying out his territorial schemes.

AUSTRALIA AND THE KLONDIKE.

Thus South African gold interests will be moulded into harmony. Next to be considered was Australia, where there is considerable mining. There are good prospects, by purchase of stock and placing his own men in control of being secured there.

A really the leading Klondike mines are controlled in London, and can be put into the trust whenever desired.

Just at present Stratton's Independence mine and the Campbell mine, in Colorado, are the most important properties for the trust to secure in order to control the American output. A great amount of dickering and negotiating has circled around these mines during the last year, while today Stratton's is being subjected to financial manipulation. John Hays Hammond, the leading mining expert in the world, who has long been in the employ of the South African crowd, is the expert who investigated the Stratton. There are many reports that the Beit crowd is planning to take over these other American gold mines when it suits their purposes. The trust hopes to secure control of seven-eighths of the output of gold in the world.

The few independents remaining outside will cut so small a figure as not to affect the power of the combination.

What will happen when all the gold is cornered no one knows. Beit gave denial to the story to-day, but returns show that he is steadily increasing the number of mines he controls. Beit is quoted as saying: "If diamonds can be controlled, why not gold?"

HON. GEO. E. FOSTER.

Bystander in the St. Johns, Que. News has no doubt who should lead the Conservative party and offers this reason for the hope that is in him: "The immediate leader of the Conservative party must be the Hon. As a critic he reaches the breadth and seriousness of the leaders of the opposition in the imperial parliament, for while he pours ridicule upon his opponents he also deals with the issue with the sense of dignity and responsibility. He is thoroughly informed, not merely upon political questions, but upon subjects which have aliterary and philosophical interest, and while he can manipulate figures and make them eloquent, he is equally at home with the academic subject, treated at leisure, with polished periods, with classic diction. He has, moreover, made himself felt in a remarkable manner, both in office and in opposition. He was always the ablest exponent of the Conservative policy. He insisted upon the traditions, upon the dignity and national importance of the Conservatives. He had eloquence and invective, but chiefly he presented an orderly argument in so lively and attractive a manner that he was always listened to throughout his longest speeches with the utmost interest. In opposition his power of sarcasm and invective found free vent, and he made use of them to the full. A man like this cannot be spared. Other names have been suggested. A man like this must be given the supreme place. Other men may advise, may be trained for eminent service, but Mr. Foster is the man who will give the party value and prestige in the house and before the country."
