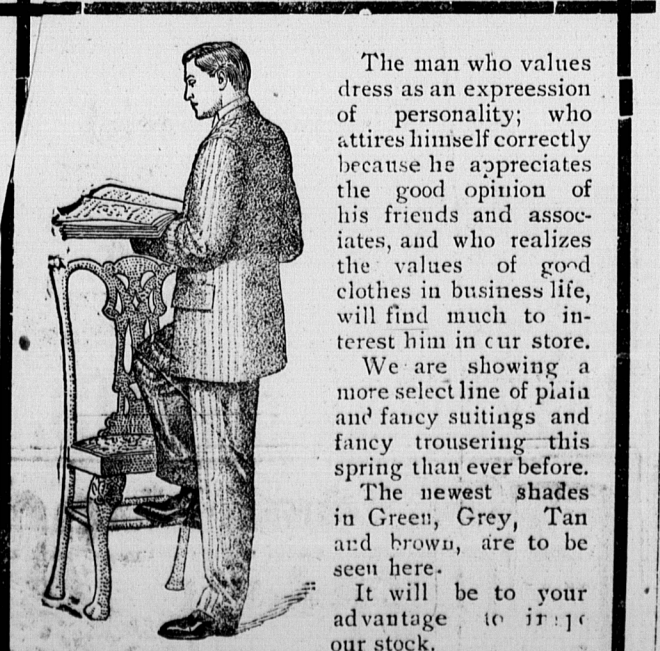

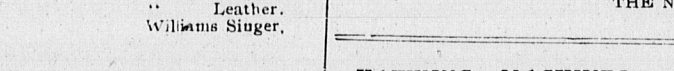

on each street in front and in the rear of the works and one in the centre of the yard. Stand-pipes with hose attached, are scattered throughout the buildings, so that every known safeguard from fire has been provided. The departments are so arranged that the pig iron and other raw materials deposited from the cars at the foundry end of the square, are moved forward and through a most interesting process, re-appearing at the warehouse end in the form of a finely finished stove or range, securely crated and ready for shipment. For the comfort and convenience of its large corps of workmen the company have made every provision. The workshops are roomy, well lighted and ventilated. The buildings are comfortably heated, a fan system being installed for distributing the warm air and promoting ventilation.

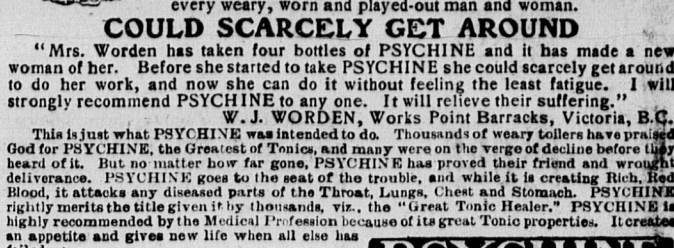

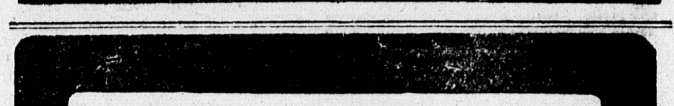

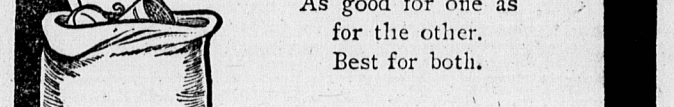
