

Sir William's Opinion.

The following important testimony, culled from the evidence given before the Select Committee of the House of Lords, on Intemperance, in 1877, by Sir William Gull, is well worthy of being kept in perpetual remembrance.

Question—Will you state to the Committee what that error is?

Answer—I think the error prevalent is that alcohol cures the disease, whereas the disease runs its physiological course irrespective of the alcohol.

Q.—I would you say that a moderately temperate person might be benefited by a slight use of wine or alcohol?

A.—I should hold the opposite as regards the intellect.

Q.—That is very common. I should say that one of the most common things in our society is that people are injured by drink without being drunkards.

Q.—The effects are marked and distinct to your professional eye?

A.—Perfectly, although in many cases even the man's nearest friends will not know it.

I might mention that on one occasion I was called to see a medical man who was so injured by drink that he was yellow as a lemon; he was in a state of delirium tremens, and his system was saturated to the last degree with alcohol.

Q.—I was surprised that I should be sent for, but on coming downstairs I said to his wife, "I need not trouble you by saying what is the matter with your husband."

She said, "Sir, I do not understand you."

I said, "Your husband is an habitual drunkard."

She said, "Drunkard! Sir, you never made a greater mistake in your life; he only drinks water;" which was plain evidence to me how quietly a man may drink day by day, and almost kill himself with drink, and even his near relatives not know it.

Q.—But may I just come back for a moment to my former question? There is a point shown of drunkenness in which a man may injure his constitution considerably by means of alcohol?

A.—Very materially; I should say from my experience that it is the most destructive agent that we are aware of in this country.

Q.—Setting aside the drunken part of the community altogether, great injury is being done to health by the use of alcohol in what is supposed by the consumer to be a most moderate quantity?

A.—Yes, I think so; I think that, taking it as a whole, there is a great deal of injury done to health by the habitual use of wines in their various kinds and alcohol in its various shapes, even in so-called moderate quantities.

Q.—Does that remark apply to both sexes?

A.—Yes, and to people who are not in the least intemperate.
