LONDON, Sept. 19.—(CP)—By a margin of six votes, the Labor Government tonight defeated a vigorous attempt by Winston Churchill to force its downfall and a new general election.

### To Use Russian Guns Against Reds

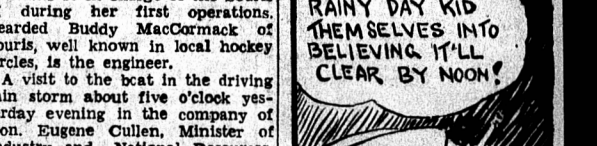
