OTTAWA (CP) - Canada's defence industry has enjoyed a booming share of increased United States spending on military equipment.

The substantial growth is continuing in 1966 and will apparently suffer little from last week's order for a \$1,000,000 cut in U.S. air munitions production.

Canadian firms filled \$200,000,000 worth of U.S. defence contracts in 1965, an increase of \$83,000,000 from 1964 and almost double the 1963 level.

Government sources say the current continuing expansion may not match last year's scale. But it will not be stemmed by the cancellation of a single Canadian contract which caused a brief stir in the Commons.

Much of the production will go to Viet Nam, but the federal government attaches no strings to ordinary contracts. It has refused applications to ship equipment directly to Viet Nam.

Production of explosives increased rapidly last year, but still represents only a small fraction of the industry's total work.

Specialization has gone so far since U.S.-Canada defence production sharing began in 1959 that no American shells, rockets and bombs are wholly manufactured in Canada. A number of their metal components may have been milled, cast and forged in this country.

Authorities have said that Canadian Industries Ltd. of Montreal, biggest producer of explosives in Canada, has more than 1,000 men turning out rocket and cannon propellants and plastic and other explosives at its Valleyfield plant.

Yet as a class, munitions manufacture is at the bottom of the list in dollar value to the industry, far behind such leaders as aircraft and aircraft engine components and parts, electronic navigation equipment and transportable shelters.

The broadly based industry ranges from all major aircraft and electronics companies in Canada to some of the smallest companies share in production, 175 of them devoting a major portion of plant and staff to the total overseas defence export business to 44 countries.

A new government calculation takes the figure to \$415,000,000 by including exports which contribute to the industry's skill whether or not the products have an obvious military use.

Canadian firms made virtually no sales of defence equipment in the U.S. before the production sharing agreement.

## Princess To Marry Commoner

THE HAGUE (Reuters) - Princess Margriet, Canadian-born, 23-year-old daughter of Queen Juliana and Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands, will marry commoner Pieter van Vollenhoven, 26, on Jan. 10. It was officially announced Tuesday.

The announcement came after the First Chamber (upper house) of Parliament approved a bill consenting to the wedding. Under the Dutch constitution, Parliament has to consent to the wedding of possible successors to the throne. Princess Margriet is the second in line, after Princess Beatrix, the Dutch royal couple's eldest daughter.

Another daughter, Princess Irene, decided not to ask Parliament to consent to her wedding to Prince Carlos Hugo of Bourbon-Parma; and lost her rights to the Dutch throne.
