NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market tumbled from its record high perch Thursday as the lure of fat profits brought on widespread selling.

General Motors opened on 35,000 shares off 1/4 at 126, touched a low of 125 1/2 and closed at 125 3/4. The AP average of 60 stocks Thursday was off 52.50, biggest fall since March 14. It closed at 173.50. The industrial component, which contains General Motors and Du Pont, was down \$4.50 while railroads lost \$1.50 and utilities remained unchanged.

Down with steels were railroads, oils, airlines, movie issues, coppers, rubbers, aircrafts, chemicals, distillers and radio-televi- sions.

Utilities were steady. Motors surprisingly enough, did well outside of General Motors. Small gains were made by Chrysler and American Motors while Studebaker-Packard was down a shade.

General Motors topped the most active list on volume of 102,500 shares. It was in the number one spot Wednesday. It was followed by Chrysler up 1/4 at 83 1/2 and U.S. Steel off 2/4 at 53 1/2.

Canadian issues were all lower. Distillers Seagram dropped 1/2 to 38. McIntyre was off 1/2 at 85 1/2 and Hiram Walker slipped 1/2 to 73 1/2. Canadian Pacific was down 1/4, International Nickel dropped 1/4 and Dome Mines eased 1/4.

Lake Shore added 1/4 on the American stock exchange and Giant Yellowknife was off 1-16. Royalite Oil remained unchanged. What stocks did
