**MELANCHOLY SHIPWRECK**—On the morning of the 5th inst. during a severe gale, in lat. 46, long 31, Capt. Depsey, of the ship Kingston, discovered at a short distance to leeward, a brig lying on her beam ends, with a flag of distress waving. Capt. D. instantly bore down towards her, when she proved to be the Albion, of Cork, crowded with passengers. Having reached within hail of the unfortunate vessel, a heart-rending scene presented itself. We beheld,—says Capt. D.—the brig reeling, ere she took her last fatal plunge—witnessed the cool intrepidity of the sailor, even at such a moment—and listen with feelings the most harrowing, to the piercing shrieks of the ill-fated passengers. The crew of the Kingston lung their best boat into the boiling Atlantic; but exertion was vain; the angry ocean soon made her its prey. The Albion went down, with every human soul on board.

“They sink into the deep, with bubbling groan,

Without a grave—unknelt’d—uncoffin’d and unknown.”

The Kingston left the awful spot, on which not a vestige of any thing belonging to the brig was visible. Capt. D. could not ascertain to what port she was bound.—*Pictou Observer.*

The Ship Hope, from London, for Quebec, ran ashore on the S. E. Point of Flint Island, about o'clock on Wednesday morning last, having on board 95 passengers:—these were safely landed; and 14 women, 25 children, and several other of the passengers have just arrived in Sydney. A Mr. Hector, a most respectable and venerable old gentleman, and his sons and daughters, with their families are amongst the number.—The passengers were all got on shore by a hawser extended from the bowsprit, in a large tub attached to it. The materials of the Ship are expected to be saved. The vessel herself will be lost.—*Cape-Bretonian, of May 25.*
