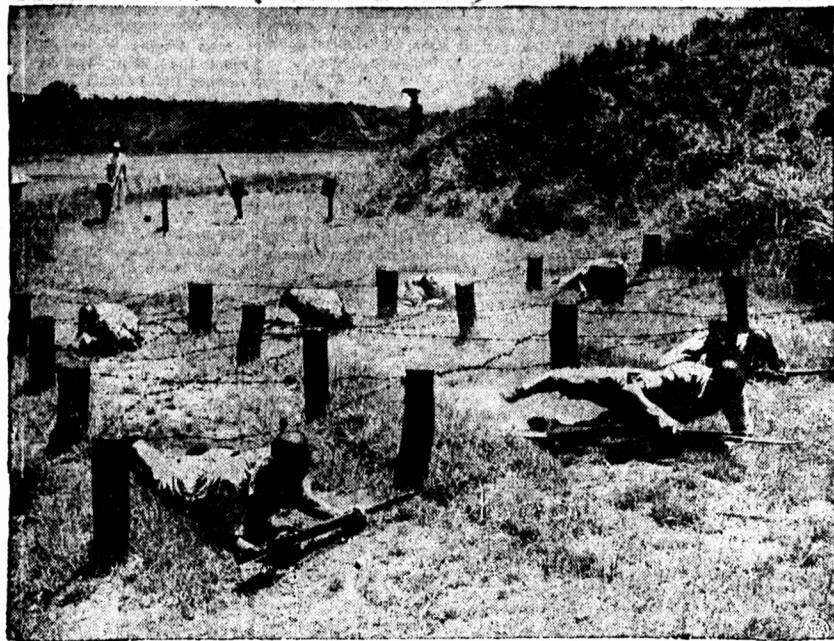

## Training Fighters on Formosa - - -

Chiang Kai-shek's reported offer to send 30,000 armored and infantry troops from Communist-threatened Formosa to South Korea throws the spotlight on the Nationalist Army's intensive training program. Chiang has 600,000 troops in Formosa, including an estimated 250,000 highly-trained, American-style soldiers under Formosan defense commander-in-chief

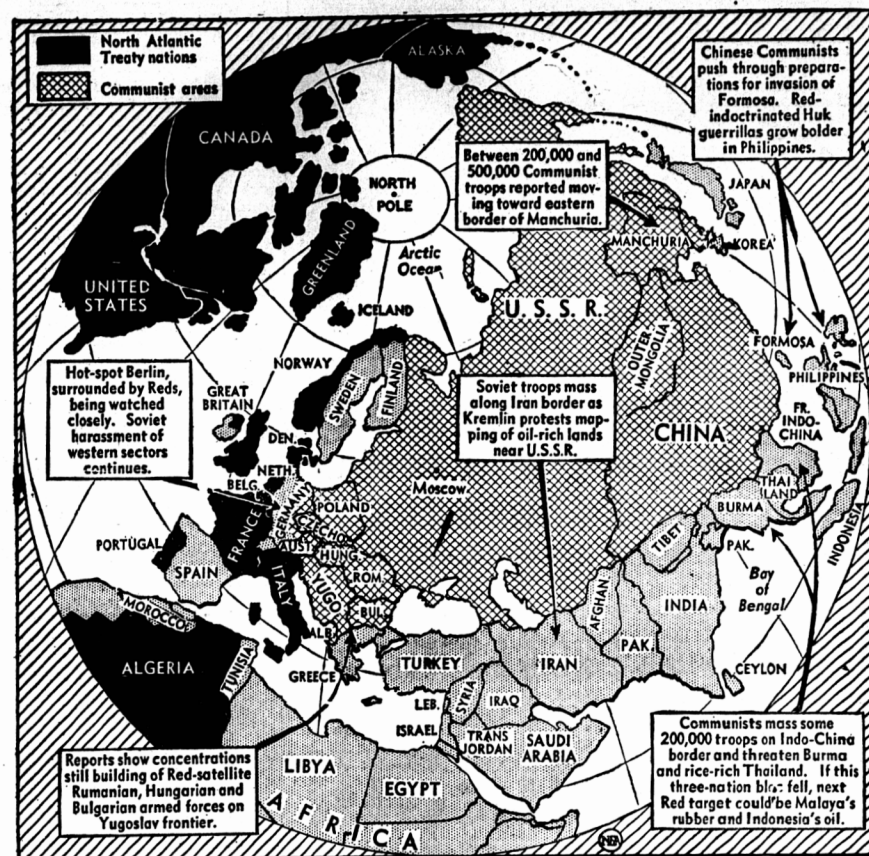

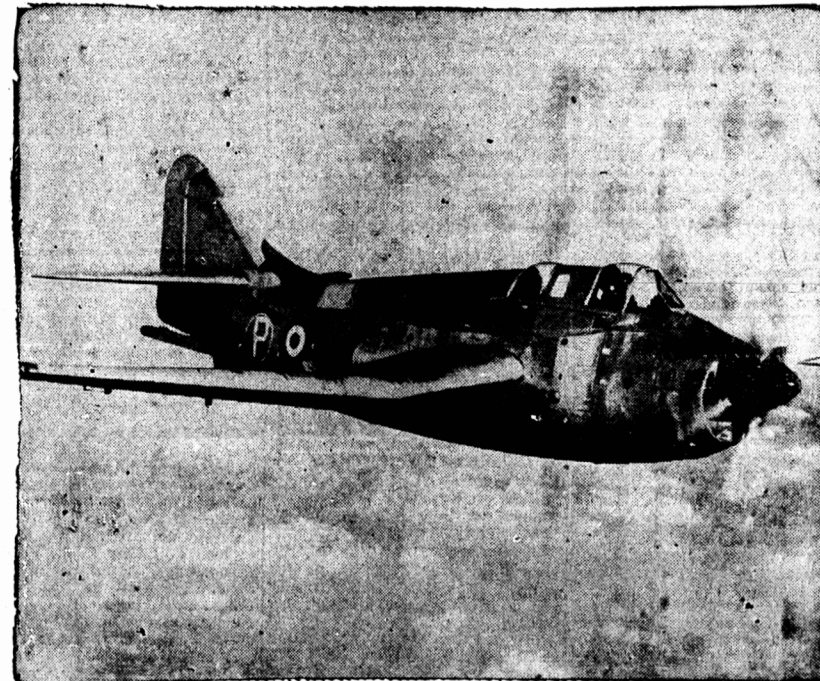

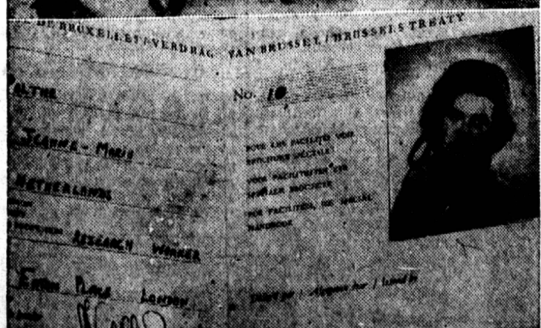
## West Unites to Defend and Educate



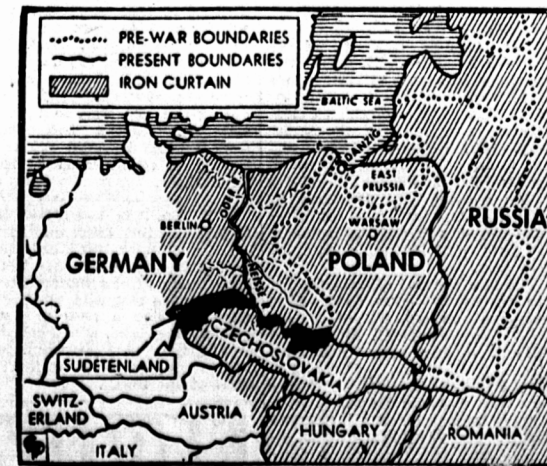
STEPS BEING TAKEN towards defence and education by the West are shown in pictures just received from Britain.

Left: Part of a "passport" to an education, issued by Britain, France, Holland, Belgium and Luxembourg, the five members of the Brussels Treaty Organization and also members of Western Union. Known as a cultural identity card, it has a portrait of Jeanne-Marie Paltche, a Belgian research worker studying in England, and gives details about her. It entitles her to certain facilities such as reduced travel rates, free entry or reduced rates to concerts, museums and exhibitions, and special privileges for visiting libraries and scientific and educational institutions. Similar cards, giving similar privileges, are issued to teachers, students, artists, scientists.



TALK OF NEW WAR—John Chang (left), Korean Ambassador to the U. S., talks with Trygve Lie, U.N. Secretary General, before the extraordinary emergency session at Lake Success, N. Y., of the Security Council to discuss the outbreak of war in Korea. The U. S. branded Red North Korea's invasion of South Korea as "an act of aggression" and asked the Council to order firing ceased there.



East Germany swallows another bitter Communist-dictated pill in renouncing all claims for 2,000,000 Germans to live in the Sudetenland (black area) of Czechoslovakia, the area over which Adolf Hitler threatened war in 1938 at Munich. At end of World War II Czechoslovakia expelled Germans from the area. Now East Germany recognizes the expulsion as a "final solution". This latest Red reshuffle follows recent decision to set East Germany's boundary at Oder-Neisse line, giving part to Poland as appeasement for land taken by Russia.



Soldiers of the South Korean republic are using American arms, equipment and military "know-how" to defend their country against Red invasion from the north. Above, near Seoul, U.S. Army 1st Lt. Raymond Moore, left, and South Korean Army Col. Chung Young, second from left, question a native soldier on the working of a .50 calibre machine gun at the American "Fort Benning" of Korea. About 500 U.S. military men have been conducting intensive training of the republic's army of about 93,000 men.



Mrs. William Goddyn stood with tears in her eyes and a smile on her lips as 175 men, women and children armed with hoes cleared her 93-acre tobacco farm of weeds in less than three hours. The group of workers came from Tillsonburg, Aiymer and Delhi, to hoe tobacco fields left unattended since murder of her husband, William Goddyn, and his employer, Arthur Lierman, of Langton, by bank robber, who they were pursuing. Farmers said they would continue to look after the fields, to see that the crop was harvested and cured for Goddyn's widow and her three young children.
