### Point de Roch Born Man Dies in N.S.

WESTVILLE, N. S. — The body of Joseph Shreennan, Church St., was found April 21, at 3:45 lying face down in a drain about 200 yards from his home, behind Silas Day's house and on the property belonging to Cecil Breen, MacQuarrie Ave. The body was found by Dennis Cook, eight-and-a-half-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Cook, who had taken a short cut from Church St. on his way home from school. Dennis immediately told his parents.

Chief of Police Ira Davis was notified by Allison Day, Dr. H. E. Whitman and Osborne Eagles were called and on arriving Dr. Whitman examined the body and had the remains removed to the Eagles' Funeral Home.

Mr. Shreennan was last seen alive at 9 Wednesday evening when he left to return home after visiting friends in Church St. On inquiries for him Thursday morning it was learned he had not returned to his home.

From 11 a.m. Chief Davis, along with John W. Fraser and son James searched and made inquiries among neighbors and friends of Mr. Shreennan but to no avail.

### NATIVE OF P. E. I.

Mr. Shreennan was a native of Mount Stewart, P. E. I., and was 66 years of age. He had worked at the Car Works, Steel Works and Pictou Shipyards during the last war and since 1943 resided with Mr. and Mrs. John William Fraser, Church St., and was well known in the community.

His eyesight was failing and he had for sometime received the Blind Pension.

He is survived by one brother, Daniel, Mount Stewart, and two sisters in the United States.

An inquest was held at 4 o'clock with Coroner W. A. Richardson presiding. Police do not suspect foul play.

### Catering For Large Groups Helped By Use Of Canned Soup

TORONTO (CP)—Spring time—annual meeting time—confronts many hostesses with questions that arise in feeding 50 or more women.

But the problem of catering for large groups such as church or club organizations can be helped by including canned soup.

Here are four recipes for main course dishes providing 50 servings using soups as their basis. They are simple to make, delicious in taste and relatively inexpensive.

### TASTY DISH

Spaghetti with meat sauce (50 servings of 5 ounces sauce and 8 ounces spaghetti): 6 lbs. spaghetti, 8 cups (4 lbs) of ground beef, ¼ cup (2 oz) olive or salad oil, 8 cups (3 lbs) chopped onions, 16 large cloves of minced garlic, 1 tablespoon salt, 2 teaspoons black pepper, 3 whole bay leaves or 1 tablespoon sweet basil, 1 tablespoon powder, 3 48-ounce cans tomato soup, 2 cups of water.

Cook the spaghetti which yields about 11 quarts. Cook beef in olive or salad oil until browned and add onions and garlic, cook until tender. Blend in remaining ingredients and heat to boiling. Simmer for about an hour.

Pour 3 ounces sauce over each 8 ounces cooked spaghetti and sprinkle with parmesan cheese.

### CHILE CON CARNE

Another dish is chili con carne. This recipe will provide 50-ounce servings: ¼ cup shortening, 8 cups (1 lb) finely chopped onions, 12 large cloves of garlic mashed, 8 cups ground beef (4 lbs), ¼ cup chili powder, 1 tablespoon salt, ¼ teaspoon red pepper, 1 teaspoon black pepper, 2 48-ounce cans tomato soup, 7 quarts (14 20-ounce cans) of red kidney beans cooked.

Melt the shortening in a heavy pan, add onions, garlic and beef and brown lightly. Add seasonings, soup and beans. Cook slowly about 30 minutes, stirring occasionally.

### EGG RECIPE

This eggs a la king recipe will make 50 4-ounce servings: 2 48-ounce cans of mushroom soup, 4 cups milk, 4 dozen hard-cooked eggs sliced, 2 cups chopped pimento and 50 slices of buttered toast.

Blend together the soup and milk then fold in the sliced eggs and pimento. Heat slowly but do not boil. Serve over buttered toast.

### MAIN DISH

For a main dish this stuffed pork chop recipe will serve 50 people.

Ingredients: 50 ¼-inch thick pork chops, 5½ quarts of soft bread cubes, ¼ cups chopped onion, 1 tablespoon poultry seasoning, 2 cups (1 lb) butter melted, 2 cups hot water, 2 48-ounce cans mushroom soup, 3 cups milk.

Broil the pork chops and arrange them in 2 baking pans (12" by 18" by 2"). Combine bread cubes, onion, butter, water and seasoning and mix thoroughly. Top each chop with a scoop of stuffing (about 2 tablespoons). Blend the soup and milk and pour over all. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for 1 hour or until chops are tender.

### Hiroshima Girls in N.Y. For Surgery

NEW YORK (AP)—Twenty-five Japanese girls who survived the Hiroshima atom bomb 10 years ago arrived today, cautiously hopeful that plastic surgery can give them new faces.

"I'm not too expectant; I expect too much, I'll be disappointed," said one of them, English-speaking Michiko Sako.

The badly-scarred girls landed from a U.S. Air Force plane at Mitchel air force base after a 6,700-mile trip.

Ranging in age from 14 to 31, they were selected from 48 girls whose scars and handicaps due to the bomb have caused them to withdraw from social activities. All were spared the embarrassment of posing for passport photographs.

### Queen's Decision To Broaden Charles' Education Cheered

LONDON, (AP)—British newspapers today cheered Queen Elizabeth's announcement that six-year-old Prince Charles will mingle with other children at school instead of being royally tutored at home. The monarch asked newspapers to spare her son from too much publicity as a schoolboy.

"We applaud this decision," says the London Daily Mirror. "We applaud this sensible outlook on the role of a prince—and a king-to-be—in this day and age."

### NOTES TO PRESS

Disclosing the new plans for Charles, Elizabeth's press secretary wrote British newspapers Tuesday that "Her Majesty and the Duke of Edinburgh have decided that their son has reached the stage when he should take part in more grown-up pursuits with other children."

"In consequence, a certain amount of the Duke of Cornwall's side his home. For example, he will attend lectures and will visit museums and other places of interest. The Queen trusts, therefore, that His Royal Highness will be able to enjoy this in the same way as other children can, without the embarrassment of constant publicity."

Duke of Cornwall is one of Charles' official titles.

The announcement gave no hint of where the prince might go to school. His education so far has been limited to tutoring by his governess.

The Queen was educated entirely by tutors. The Duke of Edinburgh, however, attended both British and European boarding schools.

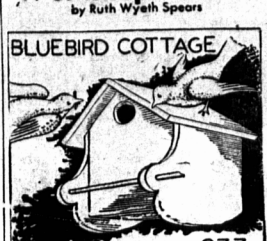
