

No Decision On Seal Pelts

Attorney General Melvin McQuaid said yesterday that investigations regarding the seizure of 3,000 seal pelts at Souris are continuing and have not reached the stage where a decision as to what action will be taken on the matter can be made.

RCMP officers seized the pelts which were said to have been landed by seal hunters operating off the north coast of the province, under the direction of Dr. Marc Arsenault, Magdalen Islands.

The pelts were being loaded on the MV Colville Bay, owned by Percy O'Hanley, Souris, and it was reported that the ship had been chartered for a voyage to the Magdalen Islands.

It is believed that the crux of the investigation is whether or not stolen goods were taken into Canada.

Police Court Hears Cases

A fairly large docket confronted Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court yesterday.

The case of Herbert George, pleading not guilty to the charge of possession of liquor in a place other than his residence, was remanded to April 27 at the request of defence counsel Charles MacQuaid.

Robert William Davey, pleading guilty to a charge of indecent exposure, was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

Two persons were charged with sounding an automobile horn so as to make unreasonable noise. One was found not guilty, and the other was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

One drunk and disorderly case was dismissed, and a case of disorderly conduct was withdrawn at the request of the plaintiff.

Stephen Younker, pleading guilty to the charge of driving without due care and attention, was fined \$25 and costs or 15 days.

A man was fined five dollars and costs or two days for failing to stop at a red stop light.

Of three persons charged with being drunk and incapable, two were sentenced to 30 days in jail, and a third was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

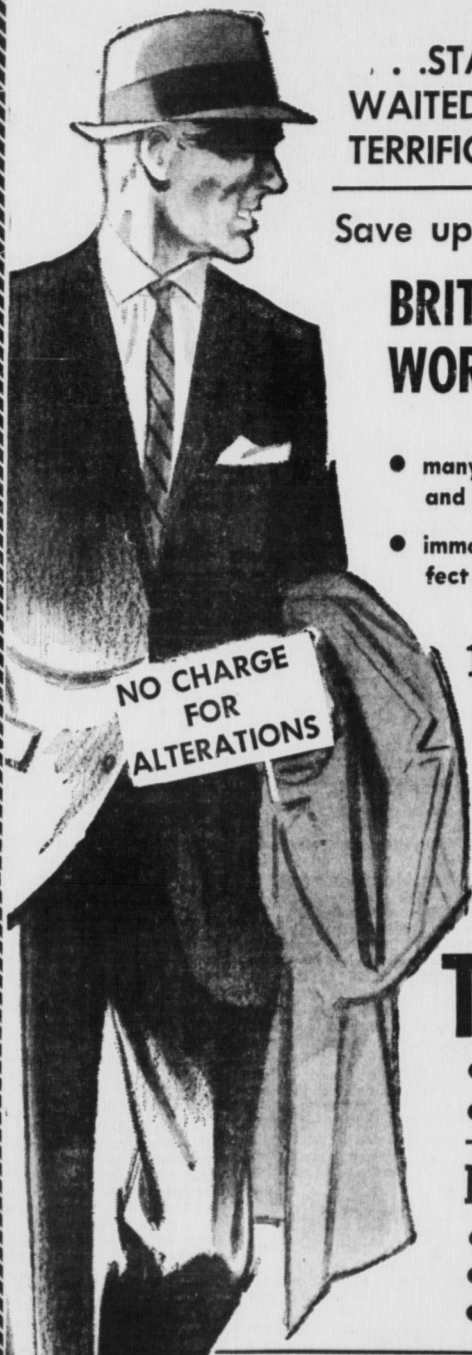

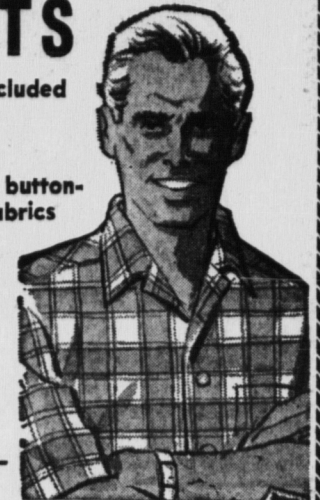
