Small experimental plots of tobacco were later cultivated by the late Sir Andrew MacPail at Orwell and the late D.J. Riley near Charlottetown.

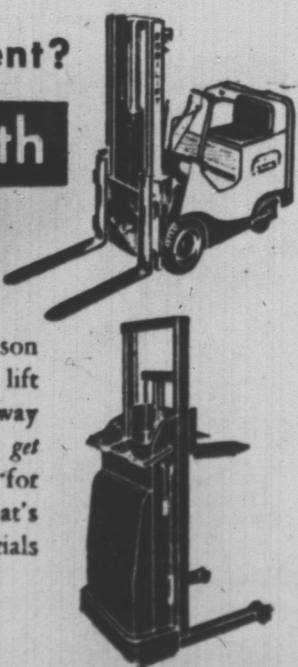
