MONTREAL (CP)—The U.S. dollar Wednesday closed at a discount of 3/4 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 5-32. Pound sterling \$2.72, down 1/2.

TORONTO (CP)—The stock market Wednesday recorded its fourth decline in five sessions as prices in all sections drifted lower gradually, reaching their low just as the market closed.
Two mining stocks, Marago (275,025) and Zenmac (247,500), had a combined total volume of more than 520,000 shares, or nearly a quarter of the entire sales for the whole board.

Golds held up for most of the day but their index followed the others to the downside just before the close.
Mining and western oil price changes were generally narrow. Issues moved in a fractional range, losses holding an edge in golds, senior base metals, uranium and high-priced oils.
Index losses: Industrials 1.03 to 422.39 golds .25 to 78.20; base metals .75 to 149.19; western oils .39 to 124.73.

Famous Nfld. Lighthouse Is Destroyed
PORT AUX BASQUES, Nfld. (CP)—One of Newfoundland's famous landmarks, the wooden lighthouse on Cape Ray, nine miles from this railway terminal, was destroyed by fire early Tuesday.
Lighthouse keeper Hiram Osmond told RCMP the 60-year-old wooden structure probably was struck by lightning during a storm in this area.
