Montague Stores Draw Schedule Of Business Hours

A special meeting in the interests of the retail merchants of Montague was called by the King's County Board of Trade last night, and was held in the office of the Maritime Electric, with Mr. R. K. Clements president of the Board of Trade, presiding.

The primary purpose of the meeting was to form a schedule of business hours for the town of Montague, such schedule to be presented to the Town Council for the purpose of having a by-law enacted to make such business hours lawful.

This meeting was in connection with a previous meeting held with the Town Council two weeks ago, when the garage owners presented a resolution to have a suitable schedule drawn up, and a by-law passed. The merchants at that time decided to postpone the presentation of their resolution until the schedule had been drawn up.

Such a schedule was completed last night, and will be presented to the Town Council at a later date.

There were over thirty retail merchants present at the meeting. The approximate schedule to be presented to the Council is as follows: All stores in the Town of Montague with certain exceptions under specified conditions will remain closed Wednesday afternoons the whole year, except from November 15th to Dec. 31st. All stores will close on Dominion statutory holidays. If such holiday falls on Saturday, the stores will remain open on Friday evening.

All stores will close on Sunday. The hours of business will be from 8 a. m. to 6 p. m., except on Saturday evening.

Murray Harbor Starch Factory Opens Today

The Murray Harbor starch factory will resume operations this morning. It was learned last night from Col. G. Elliot Full.

This word was received from Col. Full after Mr. D. A. MacDonald, Chairman of the Provincial Potato Marketing Board had told The Guardian that the Board had issued instructions to the Murray Harbor Starch Company in accordance of the terms of the original contract.

Meanwhile Premier J. Walter Jones made a second statement on the situation which said that his earlier statement about the immediate removal of the lobster pound at Murray Harbor for Fox River had been proven incorrect. He added that the lobster pound is still in Murray Harbor and apparently the starch factory's operation is at the owner's risk as always.
