

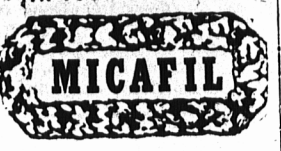

He was usually at home with a trotter or pacer and could think so quickly that he could take advantage of opportunities in driving that others would not see. A story is told of a race in which he drove Jenny Penn, owned by Dr. McAllister, which the Doctor had high hopes of winning with. However, the little pacer, Tommy Cotter, that had a tremendous burst of speed, just caught Jenny and passed her a few feet from the wire. The Doctor was greatly disappointed and said, "Fred, what happened?" and Fred, quick as a flash replied "Tommy Cot-ter!" A large number of horsemen were present at the funeral services on Wednesday to pay a last tribute of respect to one whom they will not soon forget.

Below will be found the entries for the 12 stakes which will be raced at Old Home Week, August 11th to 14th over the Charlottetown Park track. The entries total 249, an average of over 12. The largest entry is in the 2.21 Pace which has 42 and the 2.25 Pace follows closely with 39. It is certainly a great list, one of the largest in the history of the Association, and much of the credit for it is due to Race Secretary E. Frank Acorn, who has spent an immense amount of time in familiarizing horsemen in the Maritimes with the opportunities afforded them to race in these stakes.
