National Film Board Crew At Work Here On Picture

A summertime romance is the theme of a new motion picture currently being filmed in Prince Edward Island by a special National Film Board crew. The story, entitled "Island Romance," was written by George Salverson of Toronto who spent some time in the Province about a year ago gathering material for his script. The film crew, with Don Ginsberg as director, will spend two weeks in the Province making the film which will be a half hour production, especially adapted for television. The leading roles are played by Iris Krangle, a talented young Toronto actress, Danny MacDonald, a Nova Scotia actor who resides in Pictou, and Helen Roberts of Halifax. One local person, Bert Blaquiere of North Rustico, will also take part in the film. Board in this production. G.V. Fraser, Director of the Prince Edward Island Travel Bureau made advance preparations for the production and is assisting during the filming of the different scenes at Green Gables, North Rustico, Charlottetown and Belfast. Assistance has also been given by S.M. MacInnis of the Visual Education Division of the Prince Edward Island Department of Education. The Assistant Director is Clark Daprato; the Cameraman is John Foster; the local Manager is Graham Parker; the Sound is in charge of Michael Balford and the Assistant Cameraman is Mogens Gander. John Martin, district officer for the National Film Board, said it is hoped the film will be seen on television stations across Canada in December. It will likely be carried on CFCY-TV and will be shown on the series known as "Perspective." Later the film will be put in general distribution by the Film Board.

Will Bring Hundreds Of Potato Pickers To P. E. I.

Preparations are being made by the National Employment Offices in Summerside and Charlottetown to bring several hundred potato pickers from the mainland to assist in harvesting the potato crop. At the same time, every effort is being made to secure pickers on the island and to give Islanders first preference to fill requirements. The Employment Offices, however, report that in past years they have never been able to fill the many orders that come, in without recruiting a large number of people, principally in Nova Scotia. The Summerside office brings in the largest number of imports, usually in the neighborhood of 300. The Charlottetown office gets along with between 50 and 75 mainland pickers. The Provincial Department of Agriculture co-operates closely with the Employment Offices. Each year arrangements are made with the bus companies to bring workers to the province, and these are brought in as they are needed. Each of the growers notifies his nearest Employment office, the number of men he will need and the date on which they will be needed. As the men arrive they are quickly allotted to the farms which have ordered them in advance. It is very seldom possible to supply pickers on short notice, unless some farmer has cancelled his order at the last moment. TO START OCT. 1ST. It is expected that the movement to the island will start about October 1st, and thereafter there will be almost daily busloads coming from such places as New Glasgow, Sidney, and from as far away as Inverness in Cape Breton.

PASTORAL ROMANCE

The story is set in a pastoral romance, set in Prince Edward Island. Its purpose is to create an impression of the Island's charm by associating it with romance in which frequently the visual setting has more documentary purpose than the business or dialogue of the actors. An effort is made to relate P.E.I. to the rest of Canada, since the girl is "the girl from Canada" but really descends from Islanders, and through the relationship of the famous Winnipeg Selkirk Settlers to the less well publicized P.E.I. Selkirk Settlers. To the outsider, Prince Edward Island certainly is a charming and romantic-seeming place, and the purpose in selecting the romance theme as a thread has been to attempt a means of conveying this somewhat unspoken and unspoken atmosphere.
