are 6:00 pm-9:00 pm Monday to Thursday. Application forms available at this office. Salary \$5.00/hour.

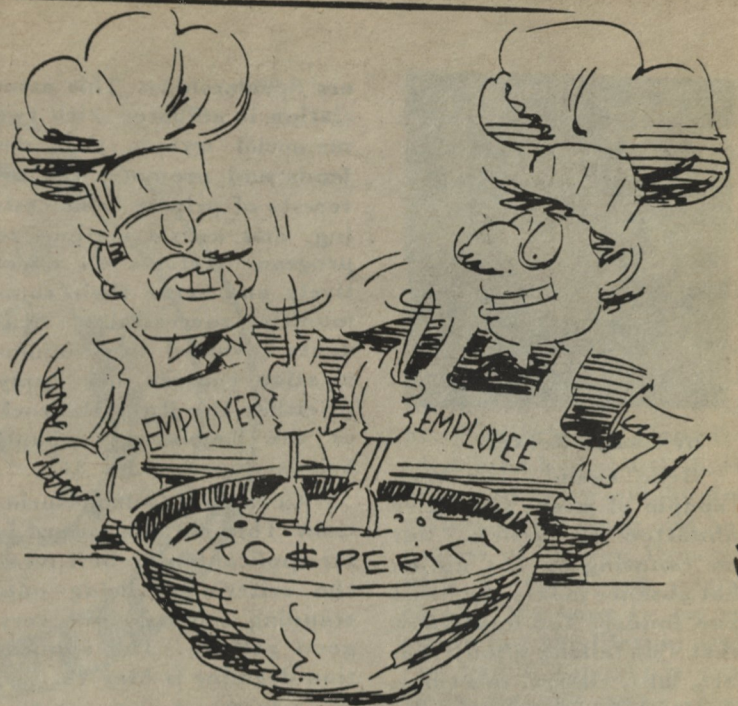

**Provincial Government** - Application forms for positions with Government Departments and Agencies are available at this office.

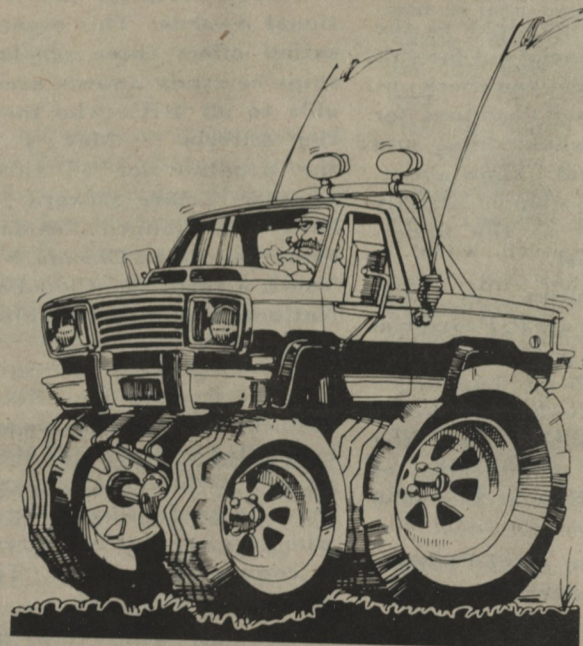
**Atlantic Forestry Consultants Limited** - Tree planters are required for Spring 1988. Application forms are available at this office and must be returned by March 31.

St. Patrick's Day was celebrated for the first time in Canada at Quebec City.

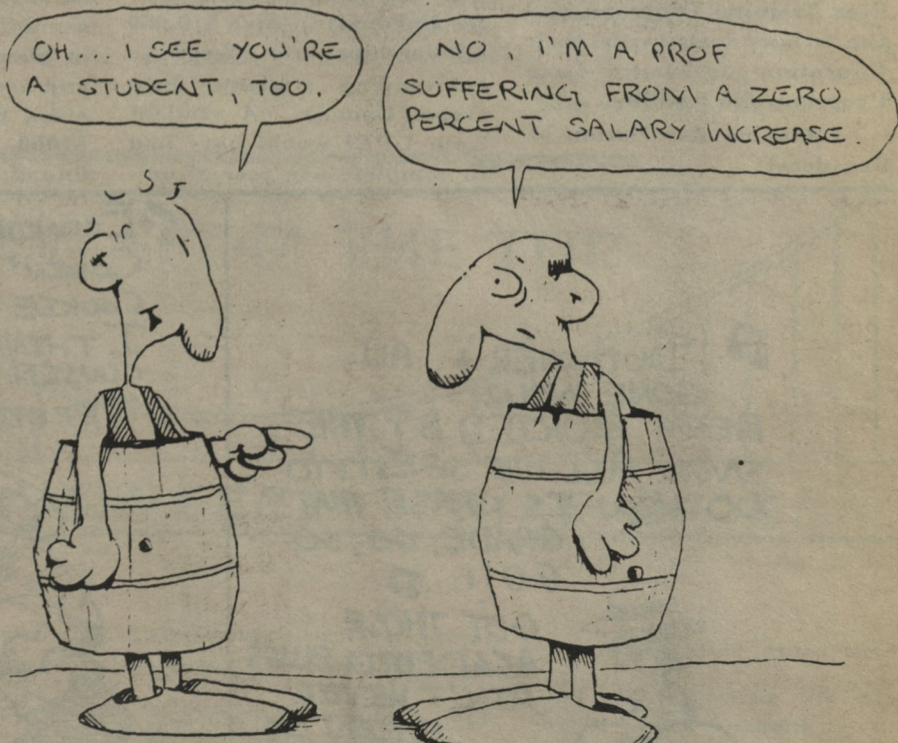
March 16
