OPINION IN ENGLAND.

Trouble in the War Office—Enrolling in Natal.

The following were received last evening too late for insertion in THE EXAMINER:

LONDON, Oct. 31.—There are fierce dissensions in the British Cabinet as a result of the crushing defeat at Ladysmith. The Secretary of State for War, Lord Lansdowne, may resign as a result of the accusation of Lord Wolsley, who charges him with rejecting his urgent advice to the War Office authorities to send an army corps south Africa as far back as July. Lord Wolsley then warned the government that the Boers were prepared to invade Natal and said that if a British expedition were sent it would prevent disaster.

Lord Lansdowne, it appears, opposed Wolsley in Council, and the Cabinet allowed Lansdowne to have his way.

FURBAN, Oct. 31.—News of the disaster at Ladysmith has spread consternation throughout Natal.

Every available man has set to work raising enrollments for Pietermaritzburg against a Boer attack.

The Boers are reported near Tugela river, 10 miles south of Ladysmith, in rear of the British position, and are reported to be feeling their way towards Colenso, evidently to destroy railway communication to the coast.

LONDON, Oct. 31.—The manliness of General White's avowal of his fault has awakened the deepest sympathy here.

Officials of the War Office say the loss is more likely due to the craze of our younger officers to distinguish themselves and obtain mention in the despatches and earn the Victoria Cross than the fault of the splendid Indian veteran, General White, despite his pitiful avowal.

Terrible excitement prevails in Gloucester and Dublin, the homes of many of the soldiers who were captured or killed.

LONDON, Oct. 31.—In addition to the loss of the men six seven pound screw guns have been lost, and as the Boer artillery is already strong the capture of these guns will be a great help to the Boers.

Apart from the immediate loss of effective troops it is feared that the defeat may have a most depressing effect upon the remainder of the Ladysmith force. It is also feared that the Boer sympathizers who have not yet taken sides will now publicly join the Transvaal forces.

LONDON, Oct. 31.—A Ladysmith despatch says: "Boers were observed this morning advancing towards the town probably to begin an attack on Ladysmith itself."

BELIEVES ANDRE LIVES.—A brother of Andree, the Arctic explorer, writes that he believes the air navigator is still alive and that he will get back to civilization some time in the year 1900. Should he not return before, it is presumed that hope of his survival will not be wholly abandoned by some of his friends for ten years to come. Some time ago a letter was received by Rear Admiral Campion from Fort Churchill, Hudson Bay, in which it was stated that two white men, supposed to belong to the Arctic expedition, had been shot by Esquimaux traders.

HORSES IN MAINE.—The breeding of horses has decreased very rapidly in Maine during the last few years, and the number of horses owned in the state is less each year. There was an increase of over 6,000 in the number of cattle in the state last year. The increase in the price of neat cattle has brought about a great increase in their numbers in Maine. Sheep have also increased to a large extent. There has been an increase in the yearling growth such as had never been known in Maine for one year, and in this stock alone the increase in valuation to the state in the last year is over half a million dollars.
