**HALIFAX (CP)**—An RCMP search and rescue helicopter grounded earlier in the day because of cloudy conditions, was to make another attempt Tuesday night to search for five United States teenagers missing in rough terrain in about 50 miles west of Newcastle, N.B.

OTTAWA (CP)—Armed with a virtual promise of temporary government financial help, the major railways set the stage Tuesday for a two-year, \$57,000,000 wage settlement with their 100,000 non-operating workers.
