**VARIATIONS**

Three different lines of play were involved in the following deal: the line declarer used unsuccessfully; the line his partner said he should have taken; and the correct line.

**South dealer.**  
Both sides vulnerable.

♠ K J 9 8  
♥ J 5 2  
♦ A J 4  
♣ K J 3

♠ 8 7  
♥ 9 8 7 3  
♦ 8 6 2  
♣ 10 8 7 5

♠ 5 2  
♥ Q 10 6 4  
♦ Q 10 9 3  
♣ Q 9 2

♠ A Q 10 4 3  
♥ A K  
♦ K 7 5  
♣ A 6 4

The bidding:  
South West North East  
1 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ Pass  
4 ♠ T Pass 5 ♠ Pass  
5 ♠ T Pass 6 ♠ Pass  
6 ♠ Pass Pass

There was little point in South's bidding five notrump, since he couldn't safely go to a grand slam even after North showed the two missing kings.

West opened the heart nine, South drew trumps in two leads, cashed his other heart trick, then went to dummy with a trump and ruffed the last heart. He cashed the club ace and took the club finesse to the jack. East won and exited with a club, and South soon had to give up a diamond trick when that finesse also failed.

North, understandably irked, pointed out that South could have made the contract by stripping the hearts and leading the two top cards in either minor suit, then continuing with a third round of that suit, throwing East in and forcing a return to the other minor-suit tenace. This was true enough as the cards lay, but it was nevertheless an unsound plan. Suppose that if South cashed the ace and king of diamonds then led a third round, it happened to be West who had the diamond queen; he would win and still lose a club trick.

The sure-to-succeed method of play (after drawing trumps and cashing South's second heart) was to enter dummy, lead the heart jack, and permit East to win that trick when he covered with the queen! South would discard a diamond or a club on this trick, and now, whatever East returned, South would take the balance.
