The following item from a New York exchange of recent date will be read with interest locally, Mrs. Davis being a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Currie, Fairview, R.R. 4, P. E. I.:
"The congregation of St. Paul's Methodist Church, West New York, held an informal farewell party for the Rev. George M. W. Davis and Mrs. Davis in the social hall of the church Monday night.
"Rev. Davis, who has been pastor of the North Hudson church since June, 1948, has completed his pastorate there and will be replaced by the Rev. David Parker. Rev. Parker, who comes from an assistant pastorate in New York City, will preach at the West New York church on Sunday.
"A buffet supper was served

at Monday's farewell party. Rev. Davis was presented with a gift of money and Mrs. Davis was given a corsage.
"John Aussenhofer was master of ceremonies at the affair. Among the guests were the Rev. Alexander A. Balden, of the First United Presbyterian Church, West New York; the Rev. Herbert J. Freeman, of Ebenezer Baptist Church, West New York, and the Rev. Curtis B. Geyer, of Park Methodist Church, Weehawken, and the First Methodist Church, Union City.
"Arrangements for the party were in charge of Aussenhofer, Robert Morrell, lay leader of the church, and the local pastors.
"A native of Newfoundland, Rev. Davis received his bachelor of arts degree at McGill University, Montreal. He was graduated with honors from United Theological College, Montreal, in 1948
"Rev. and Mrs. Davis were married in June, 1947. Mrs. Davis is a registered nurse and was graduated from the Royal Victoria Hospital, Montreal. Since his arrival at the West New York post,

Rev. Davis has been doing post-graduate work at Union Theological Seminary, New York City.
"Before coming to the United States, Rev. Davis held pastorates for the United Church in Canada in Newfoundland, Anchor and Saskatchewan. Although he has not announced his future plans, it is thought likely that he will return to Canada.
"Rev. Parker, who replaced Rev. Davis, is a former resident of Ridgewood and has been serving in New York as an assistant pastor until his new assignment sent him to West New York."

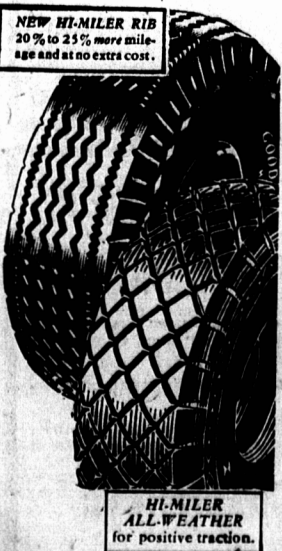
