Ottawa To Be Consulted Re Bill In House

(Canadian Press) Agriculture Minister Baker said yesterday that the Federal Government will be asked whether the Provincial Legislature legally can pass a bill prohibiting importation into P. E. I. of cattle infected with Bang's disease.

Lowest In Canada

Mr. Baker said the rate of infectious cattle diseases in P.E.I. now is the lowest in Canada. The incidence of Bang's disease in the province is the lowest in the country while the entire province is one of a number of restricted areas in Canada for bovine tuberculosis.
