Land Tax, 1897

Owners of property are reminded that by the recent amendment to the Assessment Act, the system of valuing property for Land Tax has been changed, and it is necessary that new valuations and declarations be made this year. Such declarations to be made by the owner, occupier or agent, before the Provincial Treasurer or Deputy Receiver of the district. In valuing property the value of the buildings must be included. The rate of tax for 1897 is one fifth of one per cent., or 20c on every \$100 of valuation. The tax will be due on the 1st December.
