THE LATE ALEXANDER DEWAR.

There recently passed away in Auckland, New Zealand, Alexander Dewar, a native of P. E. Island, and son of Donald Dewar of Brudenell who came to this Province from Perth, Scotland. The subject of this sketch was a man of great ability and intelligence, and in youth was much beloved for his genial manner and sterling qualities.

After learning the trade of cabinet maker in Charlottetown he went to Boston where he studied Civil Engineering.

When 21 years of age he landed in Melbourne, Australia which was at that time a town sheltered under canvas.

He at once engaged in the work of house building, but the gold fever broke his energy, and he saw greater scope for his energies in the capacity of the mining camps in the capacity of a Civil and Mining Engineer. He has held many important and responsible positions, as Manager of Mines, and invented and patented a device for gold mining which was afterwards used in this capacity the world over.

After amassing considerable wealth in Australia, he came to New Zealand in 1869 to report upon the coal measures and harbor construction of Greymouth. At Auckland he met an old acquaintance in the person of the late George W. Owen, formerly of this Province, and they formed the great shipping and mercantile firm of Dewar & Owen.

After an absence of fifty years he visited his native Island, in the summer of 1904, coming by way of Vancouver and the C. P. R.

All who have seen him will remember him as a handsome well preserved man of 72. It was for him a delightful visit to the scenes of his youth. One of the great attractions was the unveiling of the monument to the memory of the pioneers buried on Brudenell Island. He was one of the speakers at the ceremony.

Contrasting with the wonderful advancement of the country in half a century, was the swath cut by the "grain reaper" among the hardy pioneers who fashioned it. He was the only one remaining of a family of six sons and six daughters. He returned home by way of Boston and other American cities.

Mr. Dewar was a man of deep religious convictions, and lived the life of a consistent Christian. He was a life long member of the Baptist Church, and a total abstainer from intoxicants from his earliest youth. He indeed wore the white flower of a blameless life. His wife (who was a native of Edinburgh, Scotland,) with four sons and four daughters survive him. He was a first cousin of the late Robert Dewar, of New Perth, father of J. A. Dewar, M. P. P. and Dr. G. F. Dewar, M. P. P.

PARIS, March 14—In a shop excavated in the "Street of Abundance" leading to the Amphitheatre at Pompeii has been found a row of wine jars so placed that it would seem the vintner was pouring wine from one into the other when he was overtaken by the wave of lava in A. D. 79.

According to a writer in the Temps, the shop may be regarded as nothing more or less than an early Roman saloon. The cash till made of ivory, was found just as it was left by the panic-stricken owner. It contains a quantity of silver coins.
