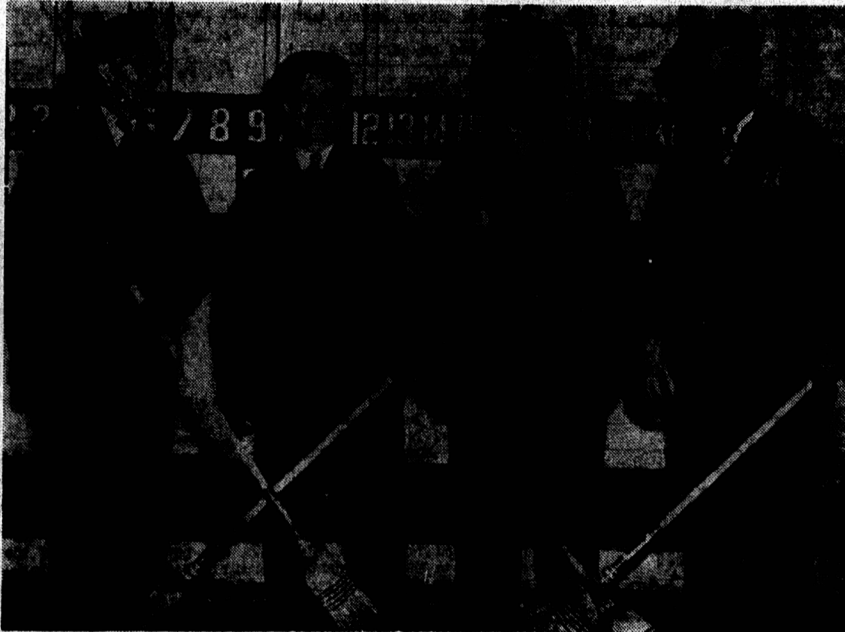

Record Crowd At Game As Richard Is Honored

MONTREAL, Feb. 18—(CP)—Detroit Red Wings spoiled Maurice Richard night for a record throng of 15,780 fans in Montreal Forum Saturday night as the National League leaders squeaked out a hard-fought 2-1 victory over the Canadiens.

The famous Rocket did his part by scoring Montreal's lone goal—his 33rd of the season—in the opening period.

Rugged Red Kelly put Wings back on even terms in the second frame. Then near the midway mark in the final period Gordie Howe, Richard's brilliant right-wing rival, added his touch to the drama-packed game with the winning goal on a sparkling play.

The top-speed, driving, solid-checking game, with only four penalties, had the crowd in an up-pose throughout. Canadiens time and again were balked by the sensational work of rookie Terry Sawchuk in the Detroit nets.

Between the first and second period Richard was presented with a new car and other gifts by sports fans. He spoke briefly in both French and English in acknowledging the tributes and was given an ovation.

The jammed-in crowd of 15,780 eclipsed the former forum N.H.L. record attendance of 15,635 set April 6, 1950, in a playoff game with New York Rangers.

Richard's goal was a short rap following a passout, with Elmer Lach and Normie Dussault assisting. Canadiens were a man short when Kelly tied the score, with an assist to Howe, on a screened shot. Howe wound up the scoring by taking Sid Abel's centre-ice pass, elickhandling around defenceman Glen Harmon and pulling goalie Gerry McNeil from the net.
