United Church Men Plan Fall Conference At Stanhope

Plans are rapidly taking shape for a conference of men of the United Church in Prince Edward Island which will be held on the weekend of September 7-9 at Stanhope Beach Inn.

It is expected that more than 100 men will be in attendance at the meeting which will be addressed by outstanding laymen from Canada and the United States. The program will also include several discussion periods and will provide ample opportunity for good fellowship in the sharing of ideas.

The idea of weekend conferences for men of the United Church has become quite popular in Ontario during the last four or five years. In 1953 the first National Conference was held at Elgin House at which 143 men attended.

The result of this conference was that each year saw additional men seeking accommodation therat. MANY APPLICATIONS In June this year, so many had applied for admission to Elgin House that the conference had to be held in two large summer resorts with 540 attending. In addition to this, numerous other conferences have been held in other parts of the Province during the year.
