Body Of Irish Patriot Returned For Re-burial

DUBLIN (Reuters) — The remains of Sir Roger Casement, Irish patriot executed by the British during the First World War, has arrived in Ireland for re-burial.

British Prime Minister Wilson disclosed in the House of Commons in London earlier in the day the arrangements for transfer of the remains to Ireland.

The remains were exhumed Monday night by prison authorities at Pentonville Prison near London where Casement was buried with common criminals after being hanged in 1916 for his efforts to free Ireland from 800 years of British domination.

The British decision brought to end nearly 50 years of Irish agitation, legal action and appeals for the return of the patriot's remains.

Casement was executed after being captured near here where he landed from a German submarine during the war on a secret mission to bring German military aid to push Britain out of Ireland.

Just before his execution, Casement said:

"When they have done with me, don't let my bones lie in this dreadful place — take me back to Ireland and let me lie there."

PLOWN TO DUBLIN

The coffin was flown to Dublin by a special Irish Airlines plane which landed at nearby Baldonnel military airport.

A 100-man army guard of honor saluted the coffin, which was met by government ministers and British Ambassador Sir Geoffrey Tory.

The coffin was taken to the military churchyard at Arbour Hill where the executed leaders of the 1916 Easter uprising were buried.

The Casement remains will lie in state at the little church until Saturday when they will be taken into the Roman Catholic cathedral in the centre of the city.

After requiem mass Monday morning, there will be a ceremonial state funeral through the city and interment at Glasnevin cemetery, resting place of the great Irish national heroes Daniel O'Connell and Charles Stuart Parnell.

PROBES MYSTERY

MONTREAL (CP) — The director of the Central Institute for the Deaf and Dumb said Thursday he is investigating reports a valuable Canadian coin collection given the institute may now be in the hands of a private collector.

The mystery centres on the Michael collection of bills and paper money gathered by Father Joseph Michael, a 19th-century Roman Catholic missionary. It includes Indian gold coins and money minted during French colonial days in Canada.

Opening lead—two of clubs.

Some of the clues a declarer has to rely on are thin and indecisive. However, any indication of how to play a hand is surely better than no indication at all, so, regardless of how uncertain the evidence is, it is wise to follow the indicated method of play.

For example, take this hand where South is in four spades and West leads a club. East takes the ace and plays a club to the king, at which point West exits with a heart.

South wins with the ace and his major concern now is to hold himself to one diamond loser instead of the two which are distinctly possible. Probably the normal play, after drawing trumps, would be to lead a low diamond towards the queen, intending, whether the queen wins or loses to the ace, to later finesse the jack.

It can be seen from the diagram that this sequence of plays would result in the loss of two diamond tricks and the contract.

However, a different method of play, specifically designed to learn more about the opponents' hands before tackling the diamonds, should enable declarer to make the contract.

After winning the heart return at trick three and drawing three rounds of trumps, followed by three more rounds of hearts, South learns that West started with two spades, four hearts, and (judging from the lead of the deuce) four clubs. This indicates that West started with three diamonds and East with two.

The missing key card is the jack of diamonds, and, since the odds are three to two that West has it, South adjusts his play to the indicated probability. He leads the four of diamonds to the king, planning to return a diamond to the queen if the king wins the trick.

But when, as in the actual case, the king loses to the ace and West returns a low diamond, South follows through by playing low from dummy and thus winds up making the contract.
