MISSION WORK

Presbyterians in the South Sea.

One of the passengers by the Warrimoo, which arrived at Vancouver from Australia a few days ago, was Rev. Dr. G. Patton, who is bound for Washington as a delegate from the colony of Victoria to the Pan-Presbyterian Convention. While in America Mr. Patton will endeavor to enlist aid for the cause of still further extending the work of civilizing the natives of the New Hebrides, or South Sea Islands.

"There are thirty islands in the group," said Mr. Patton, "with a population of probably 40,000 natives. Originally these people were cannibals, and to this day there are thousands of them who still practice that awful crime."

"Twenty-two of the islands are now practically under Christian influence, missions having 8,000 converts and over 3,000 church members. The scriptures have been translated into twenty-two different languages, each island in the group having a distinct language of its own. We have three hundred native preachers and teachers and are extending our work all the time."

"There are twenty-three white missionaries now in the islands and seven lay helpers, including three women. The missions are maintained by a federation of seven Presbyterian churches in Scotland, Nova Scotia, New Zealand, Tasmania and Australia."

Good Advice.

"Church Work" gives good advice when it says:—"Avoid making yourself conspicuous in church. In all matters non-essential, i. e., in those things which involve no vital principle, go with the majority, do as the others do. Don't try and 'show off.' If you are a 'ritualist' or a highchurchman, don't insist upon crossing yourself, or bowing to the altar, or standing up in a church where these practices are not observed. If you are a 'low churchman' don't make yourself singular and hurt people's feelings, by sitting when they stand, refusing to turn with them in some particular direction, etc. Whatever you are, and however you feel study other people's feelings. And remember in making yourself conspicuous you degrade and belittle the church in the eyes of outsiders. You advertise her divisions. Be ready to occasionally put your hobbies in your pocket, and remember that Christ 'pleased not himself.'"

Find the Time.

As a rule people can find time for anything they want to do. Thousands and hundreds of thousands of people, who cannot find time to perform their religious duties, can find time and plenty of it, for everything else. Time for feasting, and flirting, and dancing, and novel reading, and dressing, and play going, and gardening, and fiddling, and fishing, and holidaying, and smoking, and party giving and a hundred other harmless but unnecessary things. If you can't find time for religion, make time, or else for God's sake chuck it up altogether.

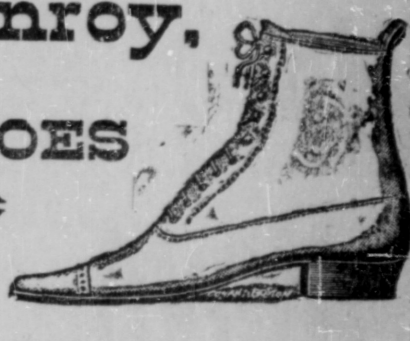
