**No Reduction in Potato Prices**

TORONTO, June 11 — (CP) — A Federal Agriculture Department order Tuesday killed hopes of reduced new potato prices. Louis Souppoff, general manager of the Dominion Fruit Company, said the new order, which becomes effective Thursday restricting importation of potatoes from the United States to higher priced class-A potatoes, will mean a continuation of current potato prices. Retailers will continue to pay about eight cents a pound and consumers 10 cents a pound. He said a 10-day delay in the order would permit the domestic potatoes to reach the market and maintain a lower price.
