"LATE BLIGHT CONDITIONS" - The weather during the past week has been very conducive to the development and spread of potato late blight, says the final seasonal Weekly Potato Bulletin. A continuation of these conditions of heavy night dews, fogs and showers will bring on a rapid development of the disease in unsprayed or inadequately sprayed fields and losses through tuber rot could very easily occur. It is recommended that the plantings be sprayed with a chemical vine killer not later than the first of October. The crop should not be harvested for at least two weeks following the application of the vine killer.

C. N. E. REVENUES - MONTREAL, Sept. 24 (CP)—Operating revenues for the Canadian National system, all inclusive, for August amounted to \$57,242,000, compared with \$55,005,000 in the corresponding month last year, it was announced tonight. Operating expenses totaled \$52,477,000, compared with \$50,929,000 in August, 1951, and net revenue was \$4,765,000 against \$4,076,000 in the corresponding month last year. Net revenue for the eight months ended Aug. 31 was \$22,273,000, compared with \$27,582,000 during the corresponding period in 1951.
