NATAL CLEARED OF THE BOERS

PREMIER SCHREINER AND HIS COLLEAGUES RESIGN.

Reports Regarding British Advance Through Swaziland.

Roberts' Last Battle—The Forces of Roberts and Buller Assist Each Other—Boers Withdraw From Laing's Nek.

SPECIAL DESPATCH TO THE EXAMINER.

NATAL CLEARED.

LONDON, June 14.—General Buller entered Volksrust Wednesday, passed through Charlestown, and encamped near Laing's Nek.

The tunnel was not much damaged. Both ends were blown up, but the engineers think that repairs can be made in about four days.

The advance troops of General Buller saw the Boers rear guard four miles distant yesterday. It was estimated 8000 Boers were withdrawing.

The townspeople of Ermelo counted fifteen guns.

Natal is now completely cleared.

SCHREINER'S RESIGNATION.

LONDON, June 14.—Mr. Schreiner, the Cape Colony Premier, and his colleagues, resigned last night. Sir Alfred Milner accepted their resignations.

The London papers only recently abused Mr. Schreiner for not making war preparations; now they are complimenting his refusal to follow the majority of the Afrikaner Bond in opposition to the British military policy.

TWO REPORTS.

LONDON, June 14.—President Fregier, according to a despatch from Lorenzo Marques, keeps a locomotive with steam up attached to the train at which he concentrates the executive officers of his government and he intends leaving Machadorp soon, to establish the Transvaal capital at Nelspruit in the mountain, a fine defensive country.

It is again reported at Lorenzo Marques that the British are advancing through Swaziland.

Lord Roberts, it appears, however, countermanded the order given to Strachan's Horse to land on the coast and to penetrate to the Transvaal through the Swaziland country.

ROBERTS' LAST BATTLE.

LONDON, June 14.—The despatch describing Lord Roberts' action near Pretoria breaks off at a most interesting point; for Lord Roberts hurriedly returned to Pretoria to get news of Lord Methuen's movement, leaving orders that

the troops were to bivouac on the ground which they had won. Yet he did not quit the field until he had seen two battalions with what appeared to be the key to the Boer position practically in their grasp, while General Pole-Carew was able to move forward and occupy at night-fall the ground which, when the battle began, had been held by the outposts of the Boer centre.

Unless, therefore, some unlooked for check to the British force has taken place, the next news is likely to be that the Boers have vacated their positions during darkness and fled to the next favorable range of hills.

ROBERTS' LAST REPORT.

LONDON, June 14.—Lord Roberts' reports from Pretoria, June 13—afternoon: "The enemy evacuated their strong position during the night and have retired to eastward."

"General Buller's force and mine have afforded each other mutual assistance."

"Our occupation of Pretoria caused numbers of Boers to withdraw from Laing's Nek, and Buller's advance to Volksrust made them feel that their rear would probably be endangered."

"Lord Methuen advanced to Honing-soruit yesterday; found all quiet and Kroonstadt strongly held."
