

Lesage Stresses Care Needed To Guard Provincial Rights

MONTREAL (CP) — Premier Jean Lesage of Quebec said Tuesday Quebec must be on its guard against any federal move that endangers its provincial rights.

He told the annual meeting of the American Society of Newspaper Editors that "autonomy is the basic condition... of our (Quebec's) assertion as a people."

"We absolutely cannot, even if it concerns a question which appears to be only a secondary one, remain passive in the face of federal initiative which we judge to be detrimental to the exercise of powers entrusted to the provinces."

Each of such measures "is a threat to the autonomy of the province," he added.

The premier said each "constitutes a precedent" which is later invoked to justify further threats involving increasingly detrimental effects.

Mr. Lesage said the fundamental right the province insists on safeguarding is "the maintenance of its traditions and its cultural characteristics."

"Quebec today is seeking, for the present and for the future, the economic, social and political conditions of an interdependence which will be conducive to its full development and which will be more worthwhile than an independence which would risk being no more than an illusion."

"Personally, I believe it is this course, which is both constructive and moderate, which Quebec should follow."

New Turbine-Powered Trains To Run Montreal To Toronto

MONTREAL (CP) — A system of revolutionary turbine-powered trains will whisk passengers between Toronto and Montreal in about four hours by next April, CNR Vice-president N. J. MacMillan announced Tuesday.

He told a press conference the trains would be supplied by United Aircraft of Canada Ltd. on a lease-maintenance basis.

CN will not buy the \$10,000,000 worth of equipment, but will pay United Aircraft an undisclosed sum for the lease. CN maintenance men will service the trains in the railway's shops under United Aircraft supervision.

Slight improvements will have to be made on the Montreal-Toronto tracks, but no major up-grading is planned, Mr. MacMillan said.

The new equipment will consist of five sets of seven cars, each set having two dome cars, one at each end. They will be operated in tandem sets of 14 cars. The turbine power units will be situated beneath the floor of the dome cars.

The first of the trains will be delivered early in 1967 and will be tested and running by April, Mr. MacMillan said. The start of the service was planned to coincide with the start of the 1967 world's fair, to be held in Montreal.

DISPLACE RAPIDO
Introduction of the turbotrains will not affect regular trains on the Montreal-Toronto run, but will absorb the service now provided by the Rapido, a fast late-afternoon service.

Plans call for elimination of crew-changing stops, or curbs, that cause delays in the current service, Mr. MacMillan said.

The top speed of the new service initially will be about 100 miles an hour, but the turbotrains have a potential top speed of 160 miles an hour.

Speeds will be increased and travelling time on the 360-mile run will be shortened as rail-system changes allow.

Mr. MacMillan said negotia-

tions were being carried out with the unions on the status of conductors and trainmen.

Two of the trains will operate at the same time. They will leave Montreal and Toronto in the morning, arriving at their destinations about noon.

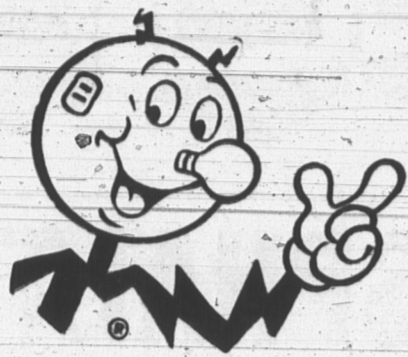
After a short stop for servicing, they will return to their original point of departure, arriving in late afternoon. After another short stop, they will do a third trip to end the day.

BUILD CARS IN MONTREAL

Cars for the trains are to be built by Montreal Locomotive Works in contract with United Aircraft. The turbines will be built at United Aircraft's plant in Longueuil, Que.

J. H. Richer, CN vice-president in charge of passenger safety and service, said travel cost would be "competitive with the airlines."

Each train will carry 340 passengers, who will enter and leave through sliding doors in the middle of each car. There will be no doors between cars. The units will be pressurized slightly to keep out noise, dirt, snow, heat and cold.

HUGE SAVAGES SPREAD TERROR

RIO DE JANEIRO (Reuters) — A tribe of hitherto unknown savage Indians, said to be more than seven feet tall, is terrorizing six tribes of "pacified" Indians living on a reserve in the Xingu region of Mato Grosso, the Brazilian air ministry has reported.

The ministry said a group of air cadets, recently on a survival training course at the reservation, brought back the news. The six tribes living on the reserve described the Krem-Aokarore Indians, as they called them, as "uncivilized, irascible and ferocious" and said they were spreading terror throughout the reserve. They said the Krem-Aokarore had weapons superior to those of the other Indians.

RELEASE PRISONERS

JAKARTA (Reuters) — The Indonesian government Tuesday released 15 political prisoners including Mochtar Lubis, the hard-hitting novelist and editor. They had been charged with planning to kill President Sukarno and overthrow the government. Student groups claim the "plot" was a fabrication by the former deputy premier, Dr. Subandrio, who now is in jail himself.

MINISTER RETIRES

AUCKLAND (Reuters) — Defence Minister Dean Eyre, 52, announced his retirement from New Zealand politics Tuesday. His retirement was the third this year by a New Zealand minister. The minister of lands and forests, Geoffrey Geraghty, 62, and the minister of transport and railways, John McAlpine, 59, were the other two.
