concerned has a predator control system in mind. For example: If a skunk or raccoon is causing trouble a trained fox would be sent to take care of the specific animal causing the trouble. In the 1930's and 40's foxes caused considerable losses to farmers' poultry. During my days as game officer I was called upon on quite a number of occasions, to investigate such complaints. On one occasion an escaped ranch fox had killed 38 half grown chickens and had laid them in a neat row, head to tail. In a potato drill I have checked scores of such complaints and invariably found that it was an escaped rancher that caused the depredation. Nowadays foxes and poultry losses caused by foxes are a rarity. Field mice, and we have them in abundance, are the staple fox diet. Strange as it may seem a farmer put in a good word for 'Jimmie' Skunk. He informed me a skunk had a cat beat a mile for eliminating rats and mice. For years he was plagued with rats and mice while his fat house tabbies sat opposite the milking stool and meowed for a dish of warm milk. Three years ago a family of skunks took up residence under his barn, eat rats and mice. He told me that during the past two years he only glimpsed one mouse and has not spotted a single rat since.

**RATHER AMUSED**  
I was rather amused when I read a letter in Sport Forum headed "Closed Season Seen Vital To Revive Upland Birds". When I asked the question — "Why the season was closed in 1963" in this Corner some time ago I gave my reasons for asking same. In 1956 we had a bumper hun population that exceeded all previous years. In 1957 we had a scant half crop and far less

than that in 1958. I started asking questions and was told that the new potato top killer was the cause. In one specific instance an observer reported he counted 11 Huns dead in one potato field after this type of top killer had been used. If a closed season was vital with respect to huns in 1963 why wasn't it more vital in 1959, '60, '61 and '62. In 1960 and '61 our Huns appeared nonexistent. 1962 coveys began showing up and in 1963 there was no doubt about it. Our huns had won the battle for survival. I have records of 35 coveys in that year and have information of additional coveys this spring of 1964.

The two past presidents of the Fish and Game Association are no strangers to this scribble. Our trails have crossed in the past, and I happen to be in a questioning mood at the moment. Why was not the season hun closed in 1963 when a vote was taken on the opening date for the duck and goose season, whether it open on Oct. 1, as formerly, or on Oct. 15.

**BLACK DUCKS DOWN**  
It was pointed out that our local black duck crop was down to a dangerous level. If my memory serves me correctly the vote was 26 — 3 for October 15 and, it opened on Sept. 30. Why didn't those highly conservation minded game association members raise their voices in protest? Who was responsible for this flagrant betrayal of our local black ducks?

I have left the \$65 question for the last. At a meeting of the Provincial Fish and Game Association held in Charlottetown a couple of weeks ago, a sug-

gested motion was discussed at length and discarded. The gist of the motion was: "That the association go on record as not being in favour of industry and natural resources action in removing the bounty on skunks, foxes, raccoons and crows and acquainting the farmers on their stand in this connection".

I was not present at the meeting but, was informed by one that was that, the foregoing covers the purpose of the motion. I was also informed that it was a group of the old guard members who dreamed this one up but the younger generation did not allow it to go to a vote. The \$65 question is: Who thought this beauty up?

Incidentally hun coveys are still being reported. This week I saw a group of the old guard within a few yards of her house, apparently bedded down for the night. No credit is due anyone except the huns themselves. They worked out their own salvation.
