IN MEMORIAM

MR. COLIN MacDONALD

The death occurred at his home Sept. 30, after a short illness, of Mr. Colin MacDonald, 128 Ottawa Street, Summerside, a citizen who was held in the highest regard by all his acquaintances.

The deceased was born at Traveller's Rest 81 years ago, son of the late Ronald MacDonald and Frances Rayner MacDonald. When a young man he went to the United States where he was employed for a number of years and married Miss Bertha Cotton, formerly of Wellington, P.E.I. Shortly after their marriage they returned to Prince Edward Island and purchased a farm in Sherbrook where they erected a comfortable home. At that time the district was known as Grange-mount and they kept the Post Office in their home until the rural mail delivery system was introduced.

Mr. MacDonald's life was one of faithfulness and devotion to the members of his family. His many deeds of kindness will be long remembered by his friends and neighbors as he was a real friend to all at all times. In the community his neighborly spirit was also evidenced by the deep interest he took in all its activities.

For several years he served in different capacities as school trustee, president of the hall committee, and president of the rural telephone. Cracking with the thunder of barking guns, tromping with the roar of horses' hooves skimming across the plains, and replete with awe-inspiring vistas of scenic grandeur, "Pony Express" tells its rip-roaring story with a maximum of excitement.

This overwhelmingly powerful film stars Charlton Heston and Forrest Tucker as a pair of gun-fighting, Indian-wise buddies, known respectively as Buffalo Bill Cody and Wild Bill Hickox. On the distaff side there are two lovely ladies, Rhonda Fleming and Jan Sterling. Both the Indian-haired beauty, Rhonda, who portrays a lady from California and blue-eyed Jan who has her tresses shorn to a bold "buckskin" bob and dons denim and cavalry boots to play the role of a tomboyish army brat, are in love with Heston.

Romance, however, is far from Heston's mind.
