Freeze On Coin Orders Is Lifted

OTTAWA (CP)—Finance Minister Gordon has announced that by the end of July the mint will have filled orders for 2,000,000 sets of 1965 coins. He lifted a freeze on further orders from coin collectors.

Six million sets had been ordered in January, before it was decided to work the mint overtime to fill 2,000,000 of them. Orders for 4,000,000 were returned and a freeze placed on any new ones.

Mr. Gordon told the Commons that the mint has been working three shifts a day, six days a week to fill the orders for 2,000,000. Up to Wednesday orders for 1,100,000 sets had been filled at a price of 94¢ a set. "It is expected that the bal-

ance of these 2,000,000 sets will be produced and shipped out before the end of July," Mr. Gordon said.

ACCEPT ORDERS AGAIN

Mr. Gordon said that "beginning today (Thursday) the mint will resume accepting orders for 1965 sets of uncirculated coins from all who want them and whose requirements are not already met, or are not in the process of being met. It might be some months

after July before all orders could be filled. Mr. Gordon said the conditions of sale remain unchanged—a maximum of five sets per person at a price of 94¢ per set. Those who ordered sets, received them and then returned them to the mint with instructions to readdress them would be charged \$1 by the mint for this service. Mr. Gordon said that since all orders will be filled there is no need for collectors to pay high speculative prices for the coin sets.
