BEEF FOR THE SOLDIERS.

One of the army scandals in which Secretary Alger and Commissary General Eagan are implicated, is that "embalmed beef" was supplied to soldiers. Captain Barclay H. Warburton, of the Pennsylvania Volunteer Battalion of Artillery, who was with the army in Porto Rico gives sworn testimony as to the bad quality of the beef served out to the soldiers. In the course of a written statement he declares: All beef issued to my battalion was bad, and had to be buried immediately upon delivery at our camp, which was about two miles beyond Ponce, at a place called Banos de Quintana, which necessitated its transportation, I should say a distance of six miles from the commissary depot, which was at the Plava. One day in question, Private Heck of Light Battery C, Pennsylvania Volunteer Artillery, was sent for an issue of beef, which his captain had been notified would be issued in the morning on which he was sent. On his return I met the wagon, and while it was some hundred and fifty yards from me I noticed the most terrible odor, which seemed to me to smell something like carrion. I was mounted, and when I got alongside of the wagon I looked into it and saw the meat which had been issued to him for Light Battery C, Pennsylvania Volunteer Artillery. It looked white, about the color of the belly of a flounder which had been covered with a green slime. I instructed him to present my compliments to his commanding officer, Lieut. Bear, with instructions to have the meat buried immediately upon its arrival at camp. Other beef—that was available—caused violent illness as a result of the boric and salicylic acid used in its preservation. It is clear that someone ought to be brought to punishment for this crime against the soldiers of the United States.

More Life in Cheese.

MONTREAL, Jan., 29.—There appears to be a little more life in the cheese market, the demand for qualities something under finest being a feature. The actual amount of business doing, however, is small, as buyers and sellers ideas are still somewhat apart. Cheese costing about 9 1-2c would be popular with buyers no doubt, but sellers are not inclined to let anything very desirable go at that figure. As to real finest the idea seems to be about 10c to 10 3-8c for western and eastern.

Unstable Condition in Austria.

BERLIN, Jan., 29.—The Cologne Gazette has caused no end of a sensation by its publication of an inspired article reviewing the political situation in Austria. It points out that the Austrian Germans must consolidate and that crown must cease to favor the Slavs at their expense. Otherwise, it is declared, the Emperor will aid in dismembering his own Empire.

It has often occurred to us, when whaling in the neighborhood of New Zealand, to get a sperm whale alongside without a sign of a shark below or a bird above. Within an hour from the time of our securing the vast mass of flesh to the ship the whole area within at least an acre has been alive with a seething multitude of sharks, while from every quarter came drifting silently an incalculable host of sea birds, converting the blue surface of the sea into the semblance of a plain of new fallen snow.

The harpooners and officers from their lofty position on the cutting stage slew scores upon scores by simply dropping their keen edged blubber spades upon the soft crowns of the struggling fish, the only place where a shark is vulnerable to instant death. The weapon sinks into the creature's brain, he gives a convulsive writhe or two, releases his hold and slowly sinks, followed in his descent by a knot of his immediate neighbors, all anxious to provide him with prompt sepulture within their own yearning maws.—National Review.
