LET'S EAT

Proteins Have A Place In The Dessert Course

"Desserts top off the meal," remarked our Chef. They may be compared to the finale of a glamorous musical comedy, especially if the dessert is a fine pie.

"But we can't always have pies for dessert," our Chef, I replied. "Pies are usually too rich and contain too many calories to be served indiscriminately. Often we must choose light desserts. By that I mean desserts that contain comparatively little fat and other rich ingredients and that are not too filling in texture."

PROTEIN VALUES
"Fresh or cooked fruit is always a good choice. So are the simple gelatins and sherbets. If the entree servings are a bit small, a dessert based on eggs and milk will bring up the primary protein values of the meal and bring it into balance."

"Do you think most homemakers realize that such desserts can be used to furnish considerable protein, Madame?"
"No, many think that full proteins can only be served as main course foods. Actually, no matter how they are used in a meal, cheese, eggs and milk have just as much protein value as when served in a main course."

MONDAY DINNER
Vegetable Juice, Celery Mustard-Broiled Smoked Ham Spinach
Broiled Sweet Potato
Cherries Madril
Coffee Tea Milk
All measurements are level; recipes proportioned to serve 4-6.
Cherries Madril: Add 1 tsp. unflavored gelatin to 1 c. cold water. Next, heat 2 c. milk in a double boiler top. Stir in the gelatin, ¼ c. sugar and ¼ tsp. salt. Cook over boiling water until the gelatin dissolves.
Separate 3 eggs. Slightly beat the yolks.
Add ½ c. of the milk mixture. Then stir into the milk in the double boiler. Cook - stir about 5 min., or until slightly thickened.

This idea originated with real lace which was often so dingy by the time it emerged from the hands of the lacemaker that the yellowish shade became a sort of hallmark for real lace. Precious lace was often dipped in tea or coffee to intensify the hue, especially when a restorer worked on old pieces.

But the new lace curtains are made in delightful colors to go with, or contrast with, the decor of a room. And along with color, there are new and interesting designs as well as familiar motifs brought up to date.
