KENSINGTON W. A.

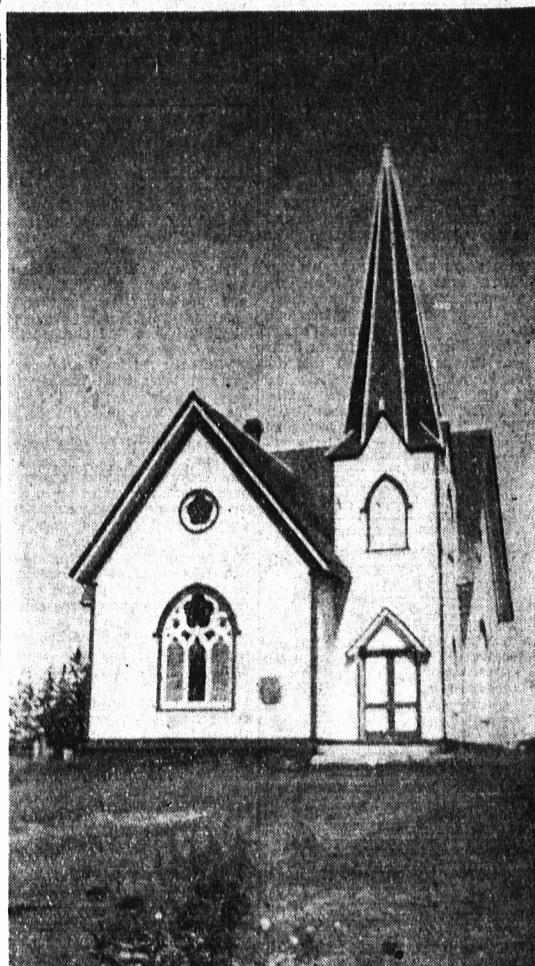
