A special meeting of the Montague Town Council was held last night to meet a delegation from the Montague Canadian Legion regarding the old post office building. The Legion delegation expressed the view that it would like to acquire the building to be used as a Legion home. The delegation also intimated that it would continue to use its present Legion building for rental purposes.

After considerable discussion by the Town Council, it was decided that the town would buy the old post office building to be used as a civic building, but if it decided to sell the building, the Legion would be given the first offer. A delegation from the firemen also waited on the Town Council for the purpose of having a dam constructed at the Burnt Bridge to provide sufficient water in case of fire. The council disclosed that it was much concerned over this matter and that it would be given immediate consideration. Two tenders for the construction of sidewalks approaching the bridge were opened. These were Henry Munroe—\$573.00 and W. H. Whiteaway—\$630.00. Mr. Munroe's tender was accepted.

Officialdom had yet to act. From Premier D. L. Campbell came word that the Manitoba government is "giving thought" to a program of action. The Red Cross said it is standing by for orders. So did civil defence. Three Salvation Army officers moved into this southeastern Manitoba town to offer what help they could.
