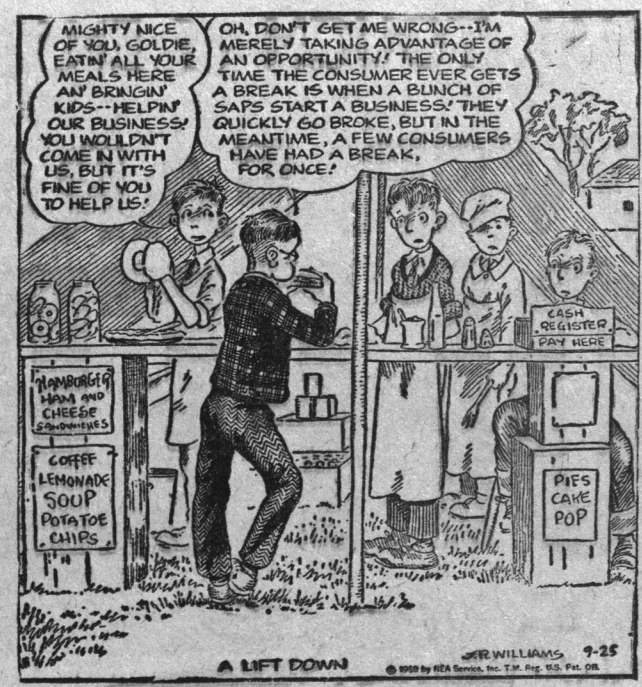

Nationalists Use Special Counters To Tally Shells

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP) — The artillery comes raining down on Quemoy in a thunderous barrage.

Inside a bunker a Chinese Nationalist soldier sits calmly tallying each nearby explosion on a piece of paper. Elsewhere across the battered island the scene is repeated many times.

These are the counters. After each Chinese Communist shelling of the Nationalist fortress off the Red China coast they come up with a total that may make headlines around the world.

BEGAN AT 41,000
"Reds pound Quemoy with record 41,000 rounds." That's the way it read Aug. 23 when the present Formosa crisis erupted.

On Sept. 11 it was "53,314 rounds fall on Quemoy." And again on Sept. 12 the total edged up to 57,746 shells in 5 hours 32 minutes.

How accurate are these totals? "They are based on an accepted method and are about as accurate as you can get without scientific instruments," says a U. S. defence command spokesman.

"We are getting more and more experienced," says Rear-Admiral Lih Ho-tu, Nationalist China's defense ministry spokesman.

WAS USED IN KOREA
The United States used the same method in the Second World War and in the Korean conflict. It uses and accepts the Nationalist figures today.

Neither Chinese nor American sources here will disclose exactly how the system is worked on Quemoy, but they describe these general principles:

The company is the normal reporting unit. It may or may not be subdivided the job down to platoon or even squad level.

Each counter is responsible for tallying the incoming artillery that falls or explodes in the air in his assigned area within a given counting period.

After the bombardment, shell holes and physical damage are added and the added count is revised—often downward—as the ground evidence indicates. This helps eliminate expected overlap-

ping of counts from adjoining areas.

When the company total is arrived at it is forwarded to a central tallying place, usually the command headquarters, for a final, over-all compilation.

"At best it is still a refined estimate," says Admiral Liu.

But such estimates tell a story that goes beyond the mere physical count. They measure the growing intensity of the Quemoy conflict. An examination of the shell holes and damage reveals the calibre and type of shell the Reds are using. And the inspections firmly indicate the weapons being employed.

It has been established the Communists definitely have the Russian 152 - mm. gun howitzer and a 122-mm. cannon. The duds perhaps are the most eloquent of all. Says the offence command spokesman:

"I have seen the Russian inscriptions on them. The Chinese Communists have lots of artillery and the Russians are furnishing it."

Mayor Charges Dosco Running Westville, N.S.

WESTVILLE, N. S. (CP)— Mayor Alfred Matheson of this depressed coal-mining town charged Saturday that government is not big enough to "antagonize" Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation.

The miner-mayor told officials of the Union of Nova Scotia Municipalities that Dosco had blocked an independent company's efforts to mine the town's main coal seam. A. V. Roe (Canada) Limited, Dosco's owners, failed to carry out a promised coal-survey in the area, he said.

"No one wants to antagonize Dosco," he said. "It appears that Harold Gordon and Dosco are running the country."

Mr. Gordon is vice-president and general manager of Dominion Coal Company, a Dosco subsidiary.
