3,500 Chickens Lost With Barn

CANNING, N.S. (CP)—Fire Wednesday destroyed a large barn on a farm at nearby Woodville with loss estimated by owner Hubert Ellis at \$50,000. Included in the loss were 3,500 chickens. Nearest water supply, a pond, was 500 yards from the barn. In Calgary and brought in by rail and truck. USE GAS TURBINE

A unique feature of the plant is the use of a gas turbine, built at Orenda Engines Ltd. in Toronto. The turbine operates on the same principle as a jet aircraft engine but is built of heavier materials. It is designed to run without a major overhaul for 10 years.
