Remember Irish Moss? It Now Has New Use

REMEMBER when you were little and visited Grandma or Great Grandma? She made a special dessert for you that was smooth as a gelatin, but seemed more like a custard, and you loved it.

"This is Irish moss blanc-mange," she explained. "It is made from a kind of seaweed, and is very good for you."

Cooking With Moss

Irish moss probably was first used as a cooking ingredient in Ireland, which accounts for its name. In reality the moss grows all over the world, especially in cold North Atlantic waters. Much of this is harvested by hand direct from beds on submerged ledges a few feet below tide. After a storm, hundreds of workers "farm" the sea for this valuable product. When the moss is dried, more than 10 million pounds are put through traction machines to obtain the carrageenan that has become so important to the food and other industries that harvesters cannot meet the demand.

Stabilizer And Sugar

Carrageenan — the stabilizer and natural sugar found in Irish moss — is used to make ice cream smooth, to keep mayonnaise, salad dressing and chocolate milk from separating, and for many other purposes. Recently it was discovered that carrageenan could be used to make a new baby food, a natural fruit gel now being received enthusiastically by the high-chair set. More about all this tomorrow.

1 tsp. salt
¼ tsp. pepper
1 c. evaporated milk (not diluted)
3 c. coarse - diced cooked chicken
2 tbsp. minced parsley
¼ c. sliced stuffed olives
1 recipe baking powder biscuit
Add onion and celery to broth; simmer 10 min. Drain mushrooms and add liquid to broth.

Melt butter in 1-qt. saucepan and brown mushrooms in it. Stir in flour, salt and pepper; then stir in evaporated milk, and onion - celery broth. Stir-cook 3 min. making sauce.

To this add chicken, parsley and olives. Heat to boiling point. Pour into lightly oiled, low 2-qt. baking dish.

Make up recipe for baking powder biscuits and cut in 2" rounds. Place atop chicken filling in baking dish. Bake 30 min. in hot oven, 450 degrees F. or until biscuits are puffy and browned. Serve very hot.

FLAVOR TRICK OF THE CHEF

For special flavor, when making the salmon - celery - salad - menu today, add oil drained from the salmon to the salad dressing.

WIFE PRESERVERS

When replacing rubber tips on tubular legs, insert a flat washer into the tip before putting it on the leg. Tips last much longer.

Make window shades of colorful cotton fabrics. Stiffen with liquid spray-on vinyl, tack to roller, and hem with cotton fringe.
