A By-Law for licensing, regulating or preventing Billiard Tables, Bowling Alleys or other like places of Amusement.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, as follows: - From and after the First day of July next, A. D. 1892, no person shall have in his possession, custody or power, in said City, any billiard, pool or bagatelle table, or any bowling alley set up for hire, gain, directly or indirectly, without having first obtained the license therefor severally required by this By-Law.

1. No billiard, pool or bagatelle table or bowling alley shall be licensed or kept or used in any tavern, inn, house of entertainment, saloon or place where intoxicating liquors are sold, or in or upon any premises connected therewith.

2. The applicant for a license to keep either a billiard, pool or bagatelle table, or to keep a bowling alley, shall be made in writing to the City Council of said City, a copy of which shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk at least one month previous to the meeting of the Council at which such petition is to be presented.

3. The license shall be set up such billiard, pool or bagatelle table or such bowling alley, to be kept or used in any manner similar to that of the granting of any such license within such Ward, such objections to be filed with the said City Clerk at least four days previous to the first meeting of the Council to consider such application for license.

4. The objections which may be taken to the granting of any such license may be one or more of the following: - That the applicant is of bad fame and character.

5. That the premises in question amount of repair or are not in a fit condition to afford accommodation for the use applied for.

6. That the licensing therefor is not required in the neighborhood, or that the premises in which such billiard, pool or bagatelle table or such bowling alley is sought to be set up and used, are in the immediate vicinity of a place of public worship, hospital or school; or that the quiet of the place or locality in which such premises are situated will be disturbed if any such license is granted.

7. Every application for such license and all objections to every such application shall be heard and determined at a regular meeting of Council, open to the public.

8. The Council may refuse or grant any such license. In case it shall be determined to grant any such license the Mayor of the City shall issue the same, countersigned by the City Clerk, on payment to such Clerk of a license fee of twenty-five dollars for each billiard, pool or bagatelle table, and of a license fee of fifty dollars for each bowling alley, the license for the several kinds of amusements whereof has been granted by said Council, which said several licenses shall be and continue in force for one year only from the date of the issue thereof, not renewable, but the licensee may make a new application for a new license in manner hereinafter provided.

9. All such licenses shall be granted subject to the following conditions, the breach of any of which shall be deemed a breach of this By-Law: - (a). The premises in which any such billiard, pool or bagatelle table or any such bowling alley is kept or used shall be closed at the hour of ten o'clock, p.m., every evening, and not opened before ten o'clock, a.m.

(b). There shall not be any internal means of communication between the room in which such billiard, pool or bagatelle table or such bowling alley is kept or used and any place in which spirituous fermented or other manufactured liquors are or may be sold.

(c). No person licensed as aforesaid shall permit, allow or suffer any spirituous or fermented liquor to be drunk in the room in which such billiard, pool or bagatelle table or such bowling alley is kept or used or in or upon the premises connected therewith. No permit, allow or suffer any gambling in such room or premises, or any betting on any game played in such room. No permit, allow or suffer any minor under the age of sixteen years to be on or in such room without the written consent of his parent or guardian first had and obtained.

(d). Any person or persons guilty of any infraction of any of the provisions of this By-Law, including those contained in Section 9, shall upon conviction thereof before the Stipendiary Magistrate of the City of Charlottetown forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding the sum of sixty dollars for each offence exclusive of costs, and in default of payment thereof, it shall and may be lawful for the said Magistrate to commit the offender or offenders to the common jail of the said city for any period not exceeding ninety days with or without hard labor, unless the said penalty and all costs and charges be sooner paid.

THE Telephone Co'y OF P. E. ISLAND. PERSONS using the Telephone would find talking much more satisfactory if they would observe the following Rules:

1st. Speak with your mouth about four inches from the transmitter.

2nd. Speak in a moderate tone of voice, not too loud, and distinctly.
