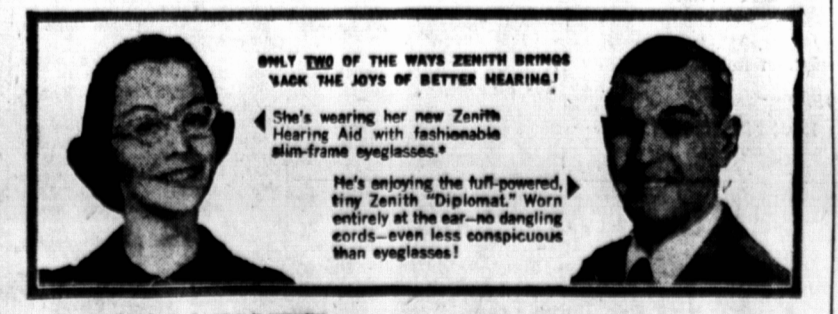

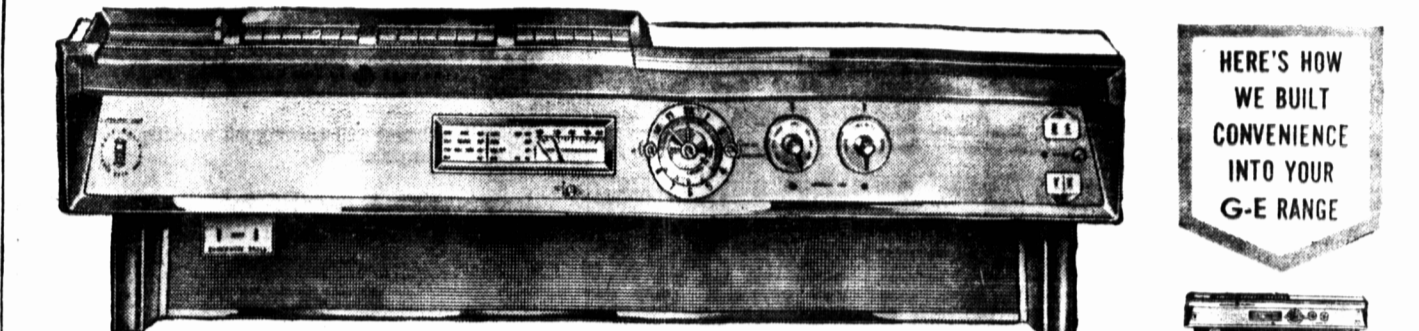
They Gave Ninety Years Service To The W. M. S.

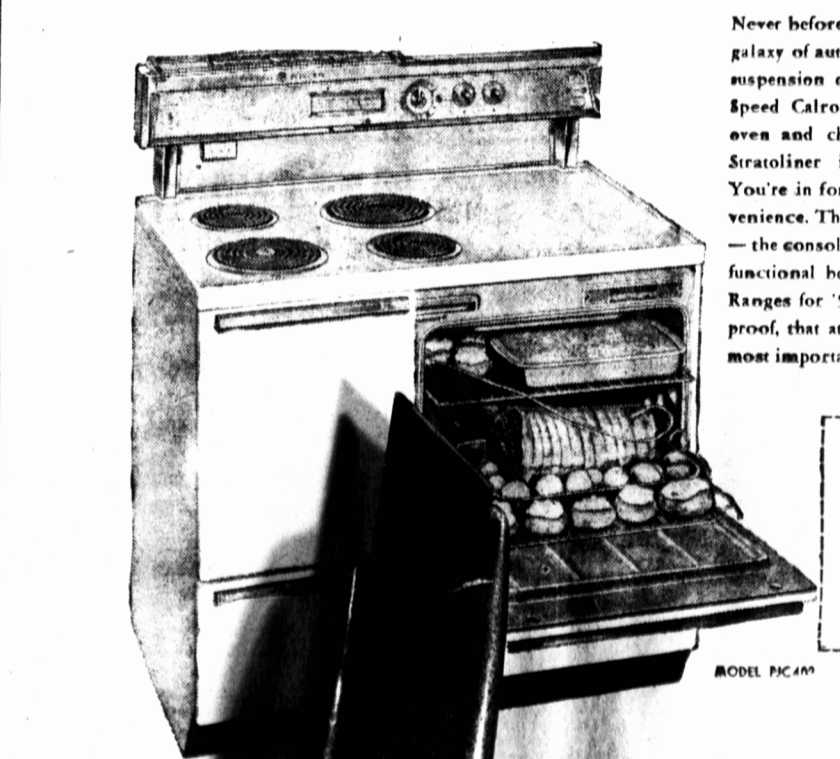
ST. CHRYSOSTOM
