

The Island Nature Trust is a non-profit organization devoted to the protection and management of natural areas. The aims of the Trust are to acquire lands to be held in trust for future generations and to manage lands as an example of appropriate and sustained use.

Meetings: The annual general meeting is held in May of each year. The General Council normally meets on the third Thursday of the month at the PEI Heritage Foundation's Beaconsfield (2 Kent Street). Members are welcome at these meetings. Those interested in attending should contact a member of the Council to confirm the date, time and location of the meeting. Every second month a public meeting with a guest speaker is held at the Farm Centre on University Avenue, Charlottetown.

Membership: Any individual, corporation, partnership, or society that subscribes to the aims of the Trust is eligible for membership. Individual memberships are \$5.00 annually.

General Council: The General Council is the board of directors charged with managing the property, business, and affairs of the Trust. It is composed of 12 members elected by and from the Trust and one member each from the P.E.I. Natural History Society, the P.E.I. Heritage Foundation, the P.E.I.
