in hay fever symptoms, but given larger doses, causing severe side reactions and weakness, the hay fever symptoms disappeared and have not returned during the past five years. Dr. Malloy reports a total of 78 cases, 58 of which were treated in the out-patient department of the Royal Victoria Hospital and 20 cases in Dr. Malloy's office in 1952. Eight cases received treatment during the year and 70 took treatment just before the hay fever season. Twenty to twenty-five injections were considered the ideal pre-season course. The success of treatment by small doses of ragweed pollen seemed dependent upon the "regularity" of the treatments and that showed that larger doses are necessary to achieve results even if more temporary side effects are present.
