**Funds Are Allotted For W. Prince Survey**

Premier Walter R. Shaw revealed further work Thursday morning from Agriculture Minister Alvin Hamilton that the federal government has allotted \$8,800 for an economic survey of West Prince County.

"The money will be matched by the provincial government to carry out the survey."

The premier said that the survey will be divided into four stages.

"Agricultural needs will be studied," he said, "including what types of new crops can be grown. Basic agricultural problems will be studied as well as the needs of small farms."

"As this part of the province is away from the main transportation connections, transportation will be gone into, including the feasibility of the West Point ferry."

"There will be a thorough study of manufacturing needs to balance agriculture. This will have no bearing on the new processing plant proposed for the area."

**Food Plant For W. Prince**

It was learned yesterday morning from a source close to the government, that the food processing plant proposed for Prince County will be established in the O'Leary area.

Premier Walter R. Shaw indicated that a plant will be established in West Prince, but declined to name the site. There is speculation that the announcement will come soon.

Late last month, the premier announced that the government will build and equip a plant in Montague for Fraser Valley Frosted Foods Limited, of British Columbia.

This company through the department of industry and natural resources has advertised for plant employees and farmers who will grow produce for the plant.

About 200 applications have already been received.

Early next week, the company plans to discuss with potential growers the types of crops it will need and growing methods to be followed.
