SIGN TRADE PACT

MOSCOW (AP) — Japan and the Soviet Union Thursday signed an agreement providing for \$35,000,000 in trade each way in 1959 — a 25-per-cent increase. Under the agreement Japan will buy an unspecified amount of wheat, 10,000 tons of crude oil, 45,000 tons of manganese and chrome ores and 350,000 tons of coal, plus other products. Japan will ship fishing boats, machines, textile and printing equipment, chemical industrial equipment, iron and steel products and chemical products.

FIND TIME BOMB

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A time bomb found under a cheerleader's stand in Memorial Coliseum could have killed or maimed many people, police say. The device, contained in a cigar box with a time clock attached, was found Wednesday. It could not be determined when it was placed under the stand. "This was no prank," said D. A. Wolfer, police crime laboratory explosives expert. "It was the real thing."

THE VIENNA CHOIR BOYS

A World Famous Choir Sings In Charlottetown

One of the oldest and most appealing musical organizations in the world, the Vienna Choir Boys, dates back more than 457 years to July 7, 1498, when Emperor Maximilian I ordered the organization of a boys' choir to participate in the performance of religious music in the Court Chapel in Vienna.

With the fall of the Hapsburg monarchy at the end of World War I, the Choir was supported by private funds and from the income derived from its tours which began in 1926.

In 1932 the choir came to the United States for the first time. Gerhard Land is the musical director and Charlottetown people are due for a remarkable concert. The program is divided into three parts the first devoted to church music, part two a costume opera and part three secular numbers.

Largest Pretzel Bakery Works Around The Clock

During our stay in Reading, Pennsylvania, the Chef and I visited the largest pretzel bakery in the world, which works three shifts a day.

"What a wonderful aroma of good yeast, good flour and good baking," remarked the Chef, sniffing appreciatively.

"That's because of quality control," smiled our host, Martin McCoy, vice president in charge of production.

"We use a special blend of flours, fine yeast and the best of shortenings. The dough is prepared here in the huge mixers. Special Blend

"Now we'll walk along to the mechanical rollers. Next, the pretzels are shaped from the dough, twisted if necessary by machine, machine-dipped in a soda solution, dusted with coarse salt and baked in rolling ovens.

"Over there are the drying racks, to dry off any remaining moisture. Nearby are the packaging and wrapping machines, and if you'll follow me through this door, here is a freight car-load of pretzels, enough to delight thousands of families."

Phenomenal Growth

When one stops to realize that pretzels have been twisted and baked this modern way for only a few years, the growth of the industry has been phenomenal. Yet pretzel "boats," which are cellophane-topped trays containing pretzels, have cost only five cents a package for years, and big crunchy pretzel sticks still sell for only a penny apiece.

Tomorrow's Dinner:

Beef Gumbo with Rice, Tossed

Salad Bowl, Hot Biscuits, Baked Apples with Banana Whip, Coffee, Tea, Milk.

Measurements are level; recipes for 4 to 6

Beef Gumbo with Rice: Tenderize 2 lbs. stewing beef cut in 1 in. cubes, by dusting over 2 tsp. meat tenderizer, turning meat with fork and letting it stand 20 min. Brown all over in heavy 3 qt. saucepan, in 3 tbsp. beef drippings or other fat. Add 1/2 c. smoked ham cut in small dice.
